Unit 6: Family

Our own family experience rarely matches the ideal of the perfect family that we carry around in our heads. This week, we take a deeper look at gender, sexuality, and family. We consider what actually makes up a family. We look at changing forms of the family using lived experience and a deep dive into demographics. We consider how changing family forms impact children. We also look at how parenting is changing for everyone.

This week, we will look at family violence - intimate partner violence, sexual assault, and child abuse. We'll look a bit more deeply at rape culture, consent, and #MeToo. While we won't be explicit about the harms done, these topics can be intense. Please take good care of yourself, step back if you need to, and ask for help.

Finally, we'll look at ways we can take action to strengthen families and reduce family violence.
