Transportation options

Walking

All of the restaurants listed are within walking distance of Harbour Centre, anywhere between 5 and 30 minutes. Google Maps is usually pretty accurate at estimating the time it will take to walk to a location. The area around Harbour Centre, Gastown, and Chinatown is nice and flat with no significant elevation changes (which is not the case in the rest of Vancouver!).

Translink/Skytrain

Taking the Skytrain or the bus is your best bet for getting around Vancouver, as parking can be hard to come by. All Skytrain stations sell Compass cards (plastic cards) and Compass passes (disposable paper cards), which can contain a stored value (i.e. \$10 that you use gradually) or you can buy a day pass if you're planning on taking more than 4 trips. Each "trip" is 90 minutes long, starting from the first time that you enter a train or bus. Trips cost \$2.10 in off-peak hours.

Note: remember to tap into and out of Skytrain stations and onto buses so that your Compass pass is charged properly. No need to tap out of a bus, though!

Taxis/Rideshare

Vancouver doesn't permit rideshares, so if you want to get a ride somewhere you'll have to hail a cab. <u>Yellow Cab</u> and <u>Black Top Cabs</u> are Vancouver's most ubiquitous taxi companies. Hailing a ride on the street can be difficult at certain times of the day, but both companies will send a car within 10 minutes if you call.

Restaurants

Gastown

<u>Gastown</u> is Vancouver's oldest neighbourhood. Harbour Centre and the Delta Hotel are located on the edge of Gastown, so all restaurants in this section are walkable in under 10 minutes.

Please note that farther east on E Hastings Street, near Main Street, the neighbourhood can be unsafe especially after dark. If you are not familiar with the area, we recommend not travelling alone.
