End each cited statement with a superscript numeral in order of appearance.^{1,2}

2. Closing

A brief closing statement.

Declarations

Ethical Approval. Already stated in Methods (committee name and approval number). Repeat here only if required.

Conflict of Interest. State any conflicts, or “The authors declare no conflict of interest.”

Funding. State all funding sources and grant numbers, or “None.”

Author Contributions. Describe each author’s contribution using the CRediT taxonomy.

Data Availability. State whether and how the underlying data can be accessed.

Use of Artificial Intelligence. Disclose any generative-AI tools used and how, or “No generative AI was used.”

Acknowledgements. Acknowledge non-author contributors (optional).

Vancouver (ICMJE) style, numbered in order of first citation; provide the first 3 authors then “et al.”; include the DOI where available. At least 80% should be primary research articles, most published within the last 10 years, preferably from reputable international journals. Citing retracted or predatory items is unacceptable. Every reference must be genuine and verifiable.
