3. [Rescind First Right Of Refusal To Allow The Sale Of Property At 13943 Key Street, Walnut Grove, California - Action Item](#)

We the undersigned members of the Chinese American community and their supporters would like to address our concerns to Agenda item #3 as stated above. We are concerned that the motion to "Rescind" the "First Right of Refusal" on the option to purchase any property in the town of Locke will detrimentally impact the rights of prior Chinese American residents, their descendants and ascendants as guaranteed under Article V, Sec.10 of the Locke Management Association Bylaws and as carried out under Sec. 2.8 of the CC&Rs of the town of Locke.

These clauses were instituted to help preserve the historical Chinese American character of Locke and to allow the descendants of former residents of Locke opportunities to purchase properties in Locke to preserve the historical character of the town. Remember at one time Chinese Americans due to Alien Land Laws were not allowed to purchase properties and thus despite generations of Chinese Americans living in these towns they were not allowed to own these properties and had to rent and lease them. These clauses in the Bylaws and the CC&R were meant to help rectify these historical wrongs and they have done well to preserve the Chinese American historical character and history of the town. The historical preservation of Chinese American history and the character of Locke as an early Chinese American Chinatown is unique and nearly one of a kind in the United States. The "rescinding of the first right of refusal" clause would be a detriment and the beginning of the demise of another historical Chinatown and the loss of the preservation of that history and the contributions of Chinese Americans in the development of California and the United States.

Locke's Chinese American history has garnered it a place in the National Register of Historic Places as a Historic District worthy of national protection. That legacy should be preserved and descendants of early Chinese American families should continue to be given an opportunity to make Locke their home. The greater Chinese American community is very proud of that heritage and legacy, and as such, is a strong supporter of travel and tourism, community and educational field trips to Locke, and we hope to continue to be a strong partner with the community.
