## Establishing yourself as a PGR: Networking and CV building

The organisers of the conference 'Understanding King James VI & I: 400 years on' (9<sup>th</sup>-11<sup>th</sup> July, UofG campus) are excited to announce a PGR-specific workshop as part of their conference programme. This workshop will take place on the first day of the conference, after the main panels. The focus will be on how to network successfully and build up one's CV, having 4 panel speakers, including Steven Reid (Professor of Early Modern Scottish History and Culture, University of Glasgow), Anna Groundwater (Principal Curator, National Museum of Scotland), Anne Dulau (Curator of British and French Art, The Hunterian), and Annalisa Martin (Leverhulme Early Career Fellow, Gender History). Attendees will also get to hear about successful networking and collaboration practices in the heritage sector, how to apply for funding as a PGR/ECR, and what work is involved in contributing to an edited collection.

This is an excellent training opportunity for PGRs, with the hour-long workshop followed by an opportunity to put new skills to the test at a networking event with delegates from the conference (including senior academics and industry partners). The event is a team-based pub quiz and buffet, with time allocated specifically for networking conversations.

The workshop and pub quiz are free for SGSAH PGRs, with SGSAH kindly covering these costs. You do not have to register for the whole conference in order to attend this specific event. However, we welcome any PGR who would like to attend the first day (or more) of the conference – please note that this will incur a reduced PGR fee in order to cover the day catering costs. Travel expenses can also be claimed when attending this event.
