Lesson Outline

Intro: Listen to Dafey Daves SafeKids online song

Lesson: Have kids share what information they should not share online. As they contribute answers fill in a chart to complete the YAPPY acronym (adapted from [Mrs. Yollis](#)): **Y**our full name, **A**ddress or location, **P**hone number, **P**asswords, **Y**our Plans. Provide an additional space to list other personal information that students suggest not to share to validate these suggestions (i.e. school name, financial information, etc).

Remind students that it is important to also be kind and polite when sharing information online. Tell them that what they share online affects their reputation and creates the digital footprint that they leave behind.

Follow-up lesson ideas: Provide lessons on digital footprint, being kind, and how to recognize a cyber bully

Follow Up:

Students can play the games from the cybersmart site to practice internet safety. Create posters to post around the school about how to stay safe online. Share Mrs. Morris Internet Safety for Students poster as a jumping off point.

Assessment: Use Twitter bulletin board ask an exit question - Keeping YAPPY in mind, give examples of what you should not include online.
