Term 3 Outline

A big welcome back to a new term and a busy semester at Sacred Heart! With a massive interruption over the past few years, it is with positivity that we approach Term 3 with some deep learning in the classroom. Lots of work ahead and lots of exciting activities planned. This term offers plenty of opportunities for studdents to share their stories and to find out more about their own personal history of migration.

Home Learning and Diaries

As part of the Year 4 /5 classroom, each child is expected to do some learning at home during the week, which will involve reading each night, as well as working on other areas of the curriculum. We understand that students have extra curricular activities (swimming, karate, football etc), but the purpose of Home Learning is designed for students to get used to organising their time and making connections with their learning from school. We believe these are good habits for young people to become successful learners.

Each child needs to have their diary signed each night by parents, as well as ensuring all notices, lunch order forms etc are placed in their school bag ready for the next day.

8.45am start

It is important that all students are at school by 8:45 am to be ready to start the school day. The morning is an important time for developing self managing skills, one of our Learning Dispositions at Sacred Heart.

<u>Curriculum Areas</u>

Religious Education

In **Religious Education** this term, the focus will be on the Sacrament of Confirmation. Students will learn about the gifts and fruits of the Holy Spirit and how the Holy Spirit is evident in their lives. They will also learn about different Saints of the Catholic Faith.

English

In **English**, the focus in Reading will be to explore a variety of texts that convey information about particular social, cultural and historical contexts. To understand that texts are written from different points of view, which lead to different interpretations and reponses. Another focus will be to analyse and evaluate texts on similar topics, themes and plots. During Writing, the focus will be on developing students' understanding of words from different cultures. Students will be creating imaginary texts as well as writing about their family history. They will continue to focus on rereading and editing their own and their peers' writing.

Serial Reader ~ One of the reasons 1 love teaching is because 1 get a chance to share my love of literature with the boys. If I can instill in each child I teach a love of reading I'm pretty stoked, to be honest. We've already read two cracking stories and this term it's Mr Tolkein's chance to stir ourt imaginations. Can't wait!



In Numeracy, this term's topics are Multiplication and Division, percentages, decimals and fractions, Time and Financial Mathematics! A big term indeed!
