

Policy Regarding Tutoring in the Center for Academic Excellence for INTO Students

As enrolled students at Drew University, all students who are currently enrolled in the INTO Pathway Program are eligible to utilize free, peer academic support resources (tutoring, academic coaching, etc.) through the Center for Academic Excellence (CAE). This includes all course offerings in subject areas (e.g., Math, Chemistry, Writing, Economics) for which tutoring is offered.

However, Pathway students currently enrolled in English for Academic Purposes (EAP) courses in CLA (EAP 101, 102, 201, 201) and CSGS (EAP 501, 502, 503, 504, & 510) are not eligible for language or writing tutoring through the CAE for those courses. Instead, students who need supplemental help with their writing and language development outside of the classroom should first seek assistance from their EAP course instructors (e.g., attending office hours).

Students may also arrange for individual or group tutoring through the INTO program. Supplemental tutors may be employed by INTO in specific cases of demonstrated need; arrangements can be made through the INTO Director of Academic Programs or the Academic Program Manager.

NOTE: Students enrolled in the INTO Academic English (AE) Program (pre-credit, English language developmental courses) are not eligible for tutoring assistance through the Center for Academic Excellence. These courses are designated below 100-level (e.g., EAP 040).
