- ❑ Eligibility: The Maine Association of Agricultural Fairs (MAAF) will be granting at least two (2) \$1000 scholarships to graduating high school seniors to give recognition and financial assistance to the recipient in their quest in pursuing a post-secondary education in an Agricultural related field.

- ❑ Scholarship Amount: \$1,000

  - ❑ Eligibility: 1. A high school senior attending a school in Maine 2. Currently enrolled in a visual arts class 3. Nominated by a teacher who is a current member of the Maine Art Education Association 4. Pursuing a degree in Fine Arts or Design fields
  - ❑ Scholarship Amount: \$500 - \$1,500 - non-renewable
  - ❑ How is this Awarded: It will be awarded directly to the student upon receipt of proof of the successful completion of the first semester of post-secondary school. The scholarship shall be forfeited if the above criteria are not met within the first year after graduating from his or her Maine High School.

- ❑ **Maine 4-H Foundation Post Secondary Scholarship (Added 1/20/22)**

  - ❑ Pursuant to Title 37B Chapter 7 Section 505(2) of the Maine Revised Statutes, dependents of a veteran who is deemed 100% permanently and totally disabled by the VA are entitled to free tuition, including mandatory fees and lab fees, at the University of Maine System, Maine Community College System, and Maine Maritime Academy. Similarly, students may be eligible for Chapter 35 benefits, which would entitle them to books, tuition, and a monthly stipend. There are over 3,000 students in Maine who are eligible to receive these benefits, and unfortunately, not all are accessing them. When a student turns 18 and is still in high school, they can access additional months of G.I. Bill benefits.
