Church groups, daycares, and real estate offices have all collected and donated. Since we started in 2017, we have delivered 1,210+ pillowcases to the Stead Family Children's Hospital, the pediatric cath lab AND the Ronald McDonald House!

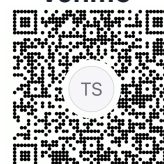
