A Few Friendly Reminders:

Help us keep our students safe by following these arrival/dismissal rules:

- 1) No dogs on school property, especially at arrival and dismissal.
- 2) Do not double park or allow your child to walk through parked cars.
- 3) Use the "Kiss & go" on Wisconsin Ave by driving Northbound to allow your child to exit the vehicle away from traffic. Southbound or parking elsewhere that requires a street crossing should be accompanied by an adult & use crosswalk.
