Students who speak a language other than English may take the SDUSD LOTE test on 1/11/23. Successfully passing this test will satisfy a high school graduation requirement. END OF "P2" GRADE REPORTING PERIOD - NOVEMBER 9

Secondary schools have two semesters. At the end of each semester (January 19 and June 6), students receive a final grade for each course. Prior to the final semester grade, students receive progress report grades at predetermined intervals:

End of P1 = 9/29/23	End of P3 = 3/1/24
End or P2 = 11/9/23	End of P4 = 4/19/24
End of S1 = 1/19/24	End of S2 = 6/6/24

NOTE: Marston holds 2 awards shows per year (February and June). The awards categories typically include: Honor Roll (3.5+ GPA), Principals List (4.0 GPA), Citizenship, Attendance and Spotlight Awards (open category).

NO SCHOOL - NOVEMBER 10

All SDUSD schools are closed on Friday, November 10th in observance of Veteran's Day.

MINIMUM DAY - NOVEMBER 15

Marston has just 8 minimum days this school year (about one per month). Our next minimum day is Wednesday, November 15. Marston's Clairemonster FIRST LEGO League Robotics team is more than half way through their 9th competitive season. Their first competition is on Wednesday, October 25th with 28 students on 8 different teams competing. They are also building and coding a robot to complete a variety of missions built out of Legos on a 4'x8' foot robot game arena. MORENA PIPELINE PROJECT ON CLAIREMONT DRIVE

Every month or so the Morena Pipeline Project moves north on Clairemont Drive. The current phase started on October 10th - going from Iroquois Ave. to Dakota Dr. <u>Click here</u> for more information. Marston administrators recently met with officials from the project to discuss impacts for when the project moves alongside our school. Staff from the project recently observed Marston's drop-off and pick-up. Marston shared that we cannot conduct a reasonable drop-off or pick-up if we were to lose the drop-off lane along Clairemont Drive during that phase of the project (expected to be December). Marston will continue to work with the City of San Diego on a solution that will work for all parties. It is possible that the majority of the "Marston Phase" can be done during a holiday break.
