May 15 Animal ID Deadline; schedule your vet appointment now

If your family would like to participate in the <u>Dog Project Training sessions</u> this summer, please pay close attention to the <u>Animal ID deadlines and requirements</u>. Schedule your veterinary appointments now to ensure you have the proper paperwork in order to submit by the statewide May 15 Animal ID deadline. Your veterinarian will complete the Affidavit and Vaccination Information portion on the <u>MN 4-H Dog Project Form</u>. You will need a form for each dog you plan to exhibit in the 4-H Dog Project. The first training session is scheduled **Monday, May 5.** If you wish to participate in that session, paperwork will need to be completed and submitted at that time. Even if you don't plan to take part in the County Dog Show, the Dog Affidavit and Vaccination Information must be completed to take part in the training sessions for health and safety reasons. Families are responsible for entering their dog ID information in 4-H Online (https://mn.4honline.com) by the May 15 statewide ID deadline.
