**I am the Spring, You are the Earth v.2** (2023) 10', improvising soloist (santoor) and string ensemble (flexible notation).

- "I Am the Spring, You Are the Earth, illustrates these East-West suffusions in quite startling ways...Eerie wailing sounds generated during the work's opening sections using slow-motion glissandos on strings provide a reassuringly avant-garde backdrop. That is, until the sudden

appearance of the santoor...[whose] metallic timbre and shimmering presence jolt the music out of its modernist sensibilities, catapulting it into a very different sonic space." ([Gramophone](#))

- "With 'Undone', written for de-tuned violin, Lolavar brings out the chaotic and unpredictable side of the instrument through scratchy bowings and fast-paced runs, embracing swirling uncertainty as much as the sweetness that came before." ([The Quietus](#))
- "The ghostly presence [of the santoor] can nevertheless be heard in Lolavar's use of alternative tunings and microtonally generated melodies. Composed in 2020 in response to the covid pandemic, the work is more haunting and fragile than *I Am the Spring*, with exposed lines on solo violin leading to violent, uncontrollable outbursts from the ensemble during the more animated middle section" ([Gramophone](#))
