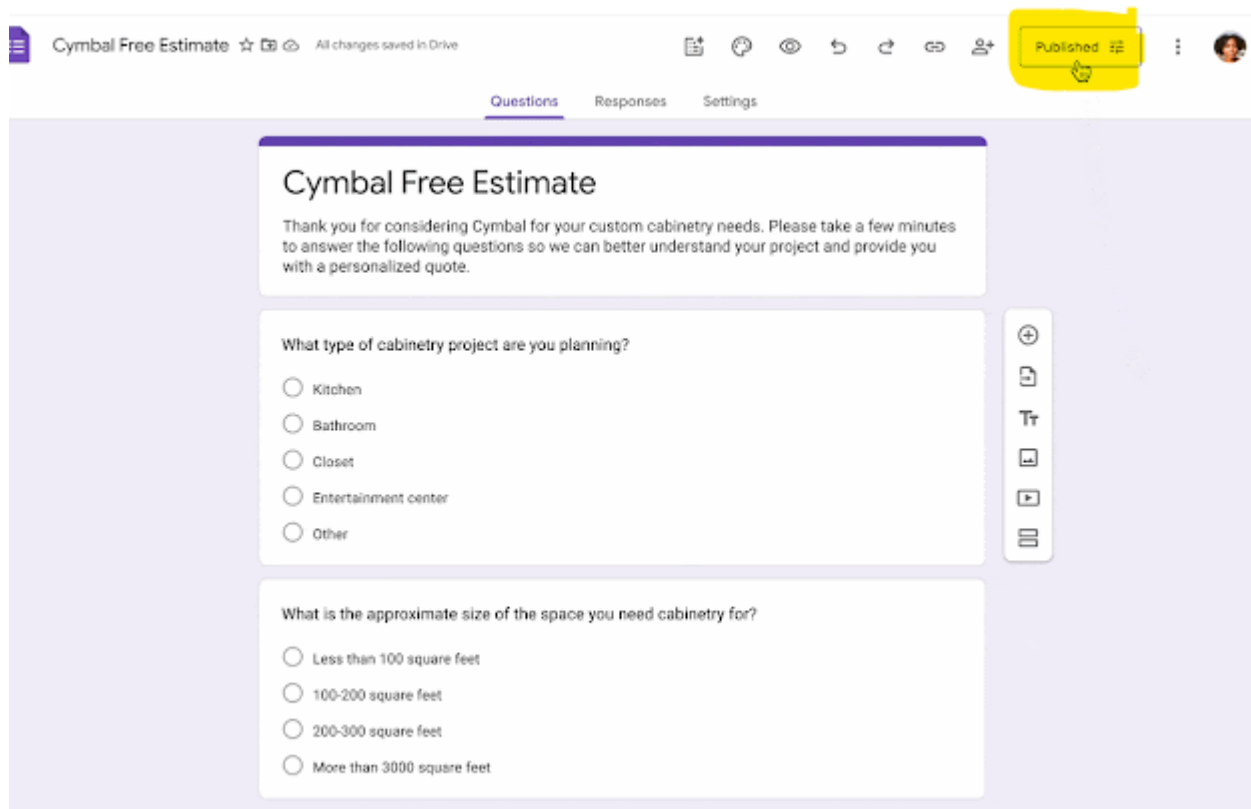
Set form to automatically stop accepting responses based on date/time or response count

Until January 2026, form creators had to manually stop a form from accepting new responses. With this new launch from Google, form owners and editors are now able to set a specific date and time to close the form, or set a certain number of responses that will trigger the form to close automatically.

This feature is designed to streamline the form closure process, offering form creators more control over data collection.

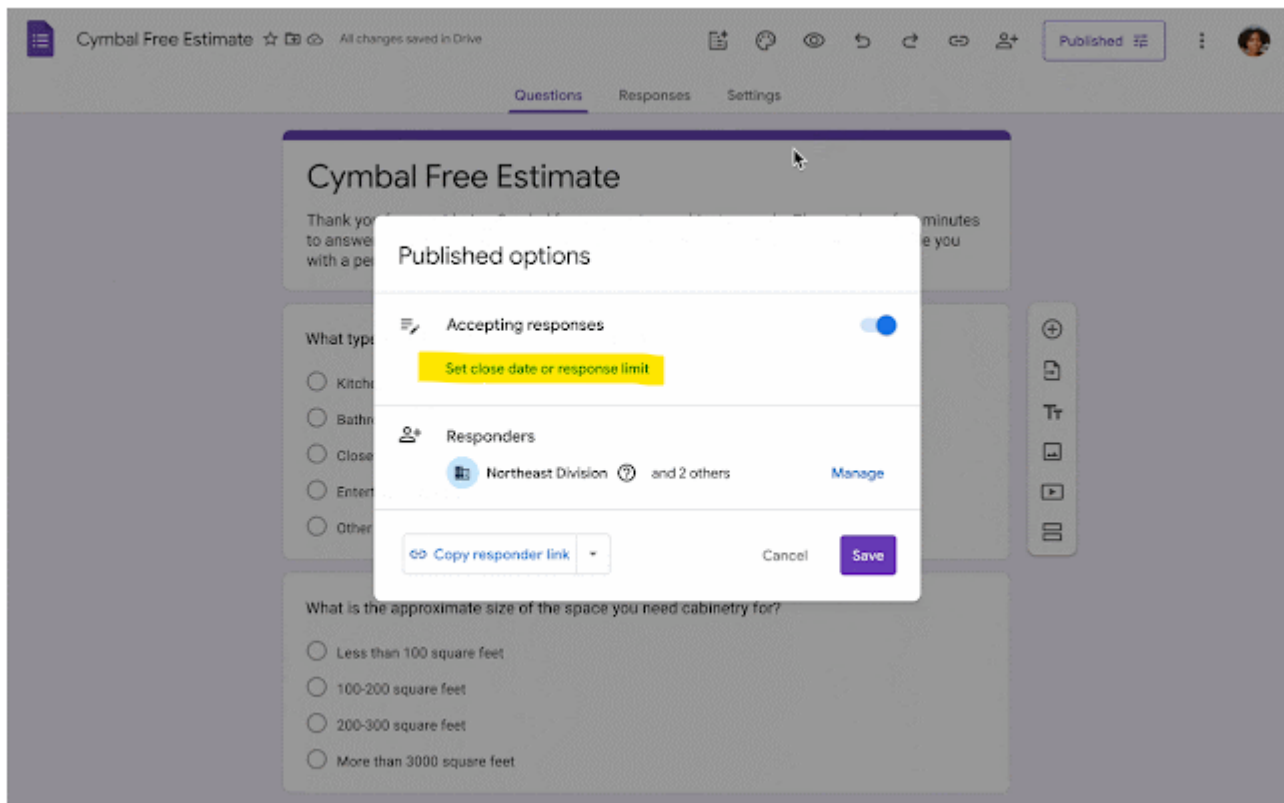
This feature is **OFF** by default and can be enabled by form creators in school after they publish a form.

- Once the Google Form has been Published - go back into the form and click on 'Published' in the top right of the form

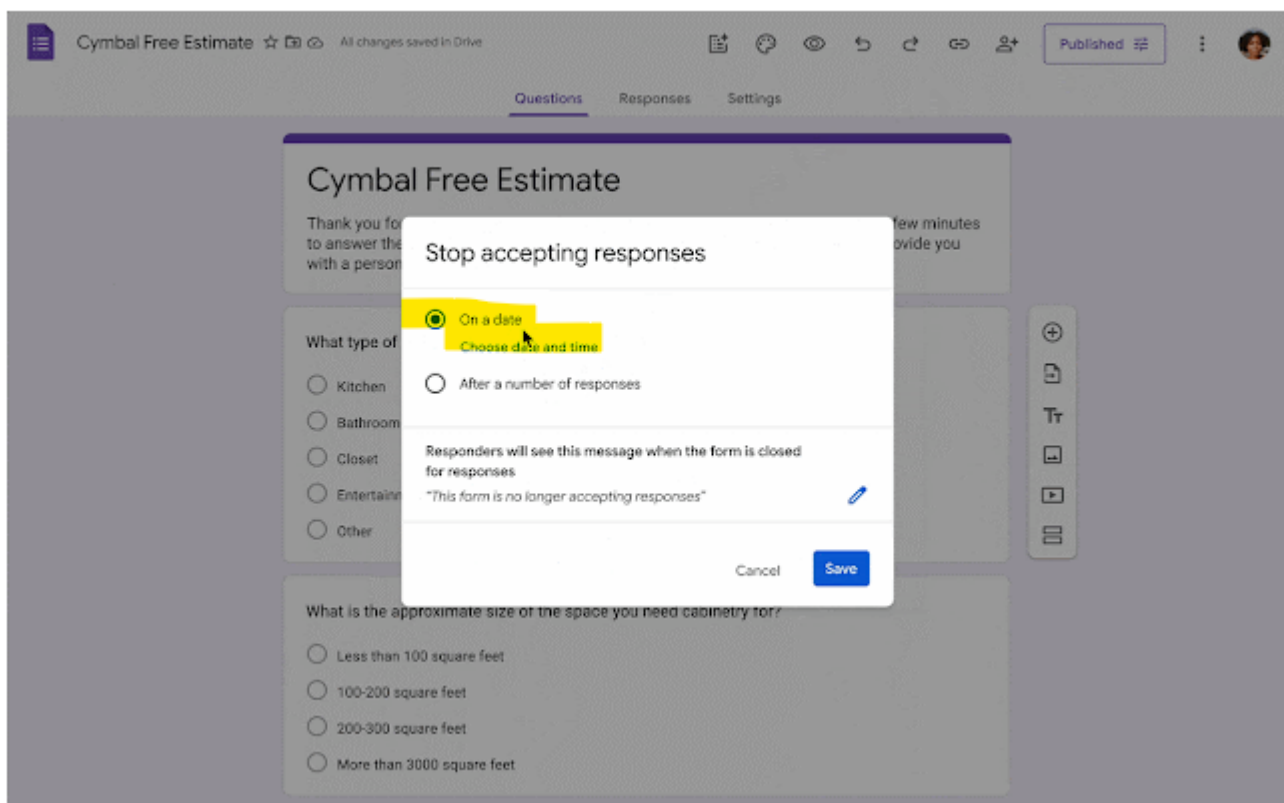

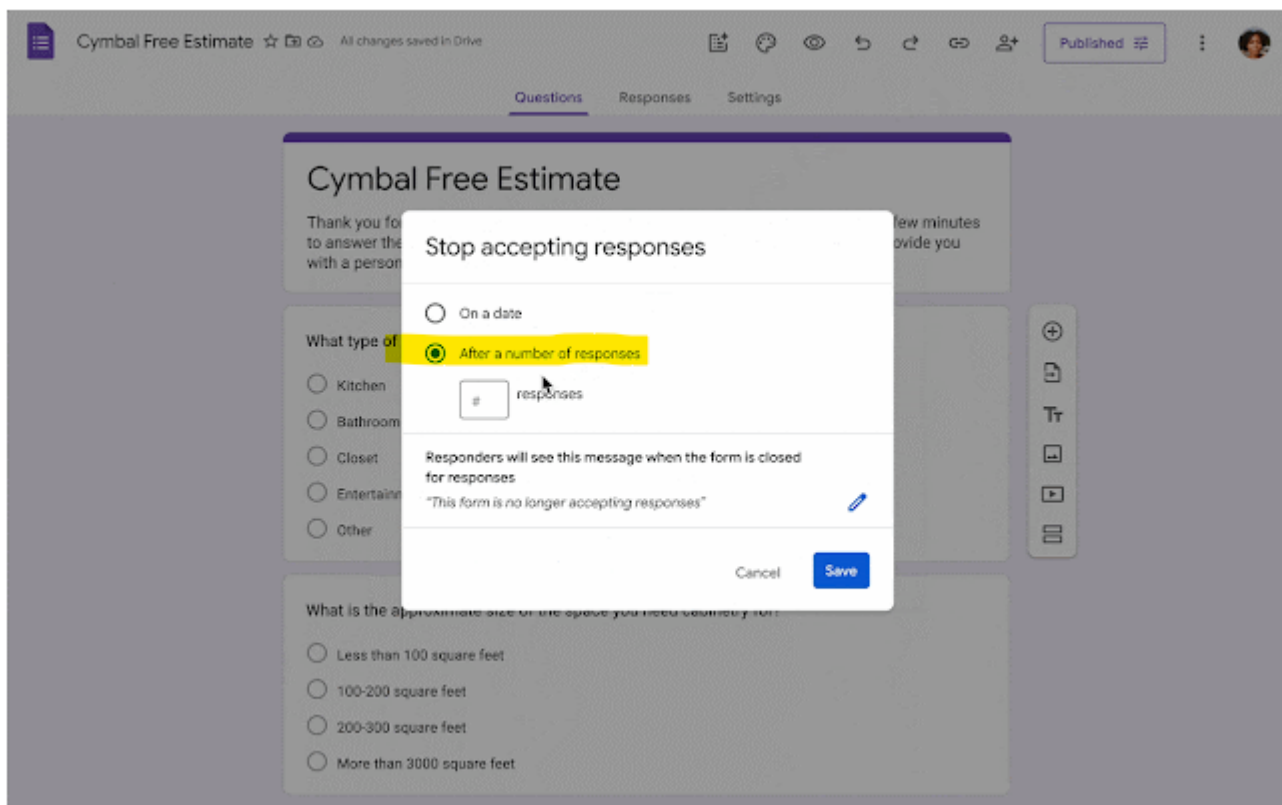
