

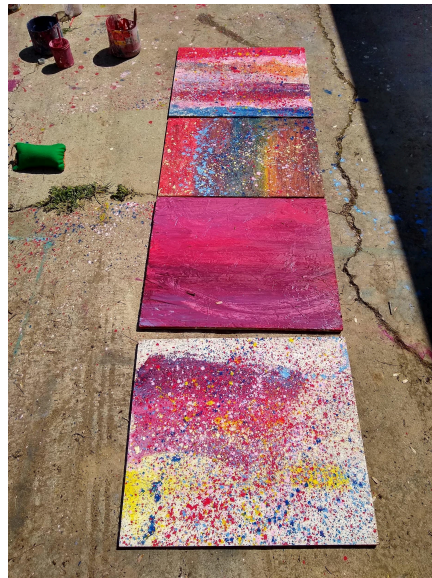
Day 18 4/2/20

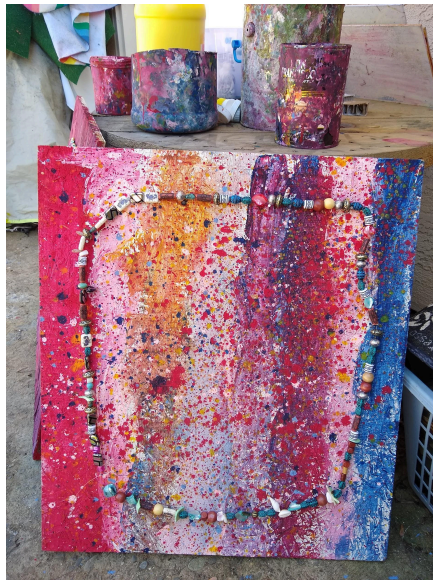
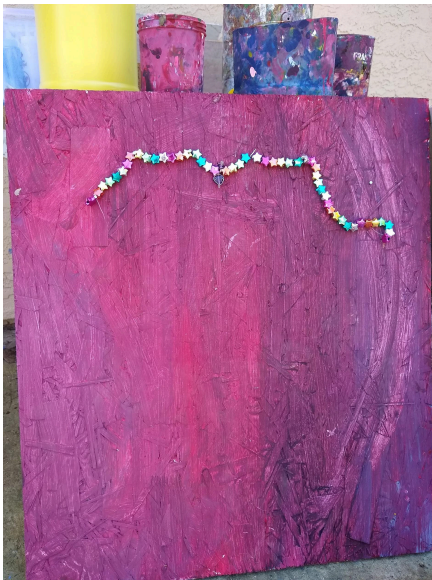
