For the Summer 2 term, there are several changes that will take place in two stages. Please refer to the stages below for specifics on what will be changing on each specific date.

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
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Stage 1: June 29, 2018 Updates

I. New Design Coming to Your Courses!



II. Navigating in the New Design




A. All New Sliding Navigation Menu

The all-new Nav menu combines navigation to weekly folders, grades, access to the calendar, and links to your courses. **(See Figure 1)**

- i. Participants: Access the course participants list. The link currently on the right side of your courses will not be available after the update.
- ii. Grades: Access your grades - The grade link currently on the left column of your courses will not be available after the update.
- iii. Dashboard: Access your My Dashboard page




B. Assignment Helps

The Importance of Public Health Research
 *It is important to become familiar with the history and significance of the field of public health and how professionals within this field assist with disease control and prevention efforts. Public health systems often provide communities with the knowledge and resources needed to promote disease prevention, health promotion, and preparation to address both acute and chronic diseases and threats to individuals' health status.*
WEEK 2
Disease Prevention
 *Methods applied for disease control and prevention could range from understanding how well public health officials educate target populations on how infectious diseases could spread, behavior modification, sanitation, and personal hygiene. Infectious diseases can be spread in many ways both directly and indirectly, including by air, animal to animal, insect bites, skin contact, infected blood, and other infected bodily fluids.*



V. Other Changes


- These style changes will not be implemented in your Summer 1 term course(s). Only Summer 2 courses, as well as any future terms, will use the new course styling.
- Regardless of the course(s) you are enrolled in, non-course pages, such as your profile, dashboard, and calendar, will be converted to the new courses design on June 29th.
- Course blocks can no longer be collapsed or docked. The new course style minimizes the need for as many blocks by providing alternative access points, as highlighted in the previous information.

Stage 2: July 12, 2018 Updates

On July 12th, the site where you access your courses was updated to bring new functionality and features to your courses. The following will highlight the changes that were made.

I. Better Calendar Management

- You can now easily manage calendar events in a popup window. Calendar improvements also include drag and drop support event update, which allows you to easily change events created manually in the calendar by dragging and dropping them to the new date.



II. Easier Activity Navigation

- At the bottom of each assignment activity, you will be able to find 'Previous' and 'Next' links, along with a jump-to menu make navigating around courses easier and more intuitive.
