 2. Sri Likhita Adru questioned her readiness given she hadn't written the policy booklet -> Larissa explained her plan to review it with the team, assess feasibility, and ensure alignment with policy advisors.
 3. Erin Neely raised concerns about potential conflicts of interest and balancing unity vs. independence -> Larissa stated she's fully aligned with the Executive and clarified her focus on feasibility rather than full control over directives.
 4. Riley Kina asked a lighthearted question about her favorite ice cream flavor -> Larissa responded, "Mint chocolate chip. I don't trust anyone who doesn't like it."
 5. Devin Woodruff asked for a concrete example of a policy from the booklet she would prioritize -> Larissa cited working with the Ann Arbor Tenants Union on housing and renter's rights, and hosting workshops for students.
 6. Angelica Previero questioned her initial comments about independence -> Larissa explained her approach of openness to new ideas while remaining aligned with the administration's goals.
 7. Sri Likhita Adru pressed on research and feasibility plans -> Larissa outlined a strategy including in-depth reviews, monetary estimates, conversations with stakeholders, and phased implementation with the policy team.
