According to Arenas, when Michael Jordan first came to the NBA, he got to play selfish basketball and no one said a thing even if his team was losing. Before he won his first NBA championship, Gil says Jordan scored close to 19,000 career points.

"Jordan got to be the individual because the league needed it at that time. They needed a face to say this is who we are so nobody critiqued him losing. Just go out and score 35, 37, 30 Do that, we need it. MVP? We'll give you MVP. We'll give you all these things which was needed then".
