# **Course Objective:**

In eighth grade, students study Georgia geography, history, state/local government, and economics. While the four strands are interwoven, ample opportunity is also provided for in-depth study of the geography of Georgia and the government of Georgia. U.S. historical events are included, as appropriate, to ensure students understand Georgia's role in the history of the United States.

The primary purpose of social studies is to help young people make informed and reasoned decisions for the public good as citizens of a culturally diverse, democratic society in an interdependent world. Students should be able to demonstrate understanding of **Georgia geography**, **Georgia's history in the role of The United States**, **state/local government**, **and economics** using knowledge and skills acquired during the school year. Understanding of these themes is not the end product of a single unit or lesson but the product of long term, ongoing instruction. The bold terms represent the connecting themes that appear in multiple units throughout this course. Enduring understandings transcend specific units and courses and increase student understanding and retention of knowledge.
