1. Lily

- a. White turn tan
- b. Stargazer turn purple/tan/white
- c. All lilies show damage very easily

2. Rose

- a. Red varieties turn a deep reddish purple or deep red
- b. Pink varieties depends on the variety!
 - i. Some turn light/dark pink, grayish pink, beige-pink, purply pink, or just purple.
- c. Toffee varieties turn different shades of purple
- d. White varieties depends on the variety!
 - i. Mostly cream or beige or they stay white
 - ii. Show damage more easily
- e. Yellow varieties turn a more antiquey gold
- f. Orange varieties turn more tan, with bit of orange or purple

3. Peony

- a. Pink varieties depends on the variety!
 - i. Coral charm turns more cream with very subtle pink undertones
 - ii. Others turn bright prink, light pink, or cream/pink
- b. White varieties turn white with some slightly beige petals depending on the variety
 - i. Show damage more easily

4. Lisianthus

- a. White turns yellow
 - i. Buds stay greenish yellow
- b. Pink turn yellowish pink or a tan-pink.
 - i. Shows damage more easily
- c. Blue (dyed) turns yellow with splotches of blue around the outside of the flower
- d. Purple (dyed) -turns yellow with splotches of purple around the outside

5. Football Mums

- a. White turn tan or cream
- b. Purple turn greyish, tannish, light purple
- c. Reddish/Orange turn purplish tan/yellow

6. Stock

a. Most colors tend to fade in vibrancy some
