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Research Profile

I am an early-career researcher in **Anglophone literary and cultural studies**, specialising in **Afro-diasporic literary practices**. My research investigates how these traditions use **sound, voice, and performance** as forms of **knowledge-making** that exceed, and actively contest, dominant literary canons. I focus on practices that survived historical oppression not only through writing but also through oral transmission, bodies, and rhythm. I aim to make visible the aesthetic and epistemological modes that have been **systematically suppressed** by a history of racial exclusion.

Alongside my research, I am committed to dialogue between academia and the wider cultural world. Together with artists, communities, and cultural policymakers, I advance debates around the representation, participation, and visibility of **marginalised voices** in cultural spaces.
