### PART A. My Story—

### FAMILY ORIGINS (ORAL PRESENTATION includes sections A, B, C, and D)

- 1. How far back can I trace my family?
  - a. From which countries did your ancestors or you immediate family emigrate?
  - b. When? Identify the earliest year a known family member relocated into current community or province.
  - c. Why did they choose to immigrate to Canada? Identify the primary economic, social or political forces (reasons) (PUSH or PULL) that motivated settlement to a particular city.
  - d. Identify any other major relocation within Canada......Ex. Moved from Ontario to British Columbia
  - e. What method of travel was used for the journey? How long did the journey take?
  - f. Were any difficulties experienced by them during the journey?
  - g. What possessions did they bring to Canada?
  - h. How did relatives and friends who stayed behind in the home country feel about members of the family emigrating? Explain
  - i. How was or is contact maintained with any family members or friends still resident in the home country?? Explain
  - j. Is the sharing of experiences with those still in the home country seen as important by members of your family? Explain
