
Who responded to the survey?

We sent the survey to 58 people, at least one from each of our 14 <u>university collaborations</u>. We biased our selection of recipients towards those we've helped recently (47 in 2021), but also included some individuals who had particularly involved relationships with BERI prior to 2021.

The survey was anonymous. There were 28 responses, all of which were submitted in January 2022.

Quantitative feedback



Respondents report:1

- 35% of projects which received BERI's help would not have happened otherwise.
- 54% of projects which received BERI's help would still have happened otherwise, but more slowly or in a way that would have taken more of their time or effort.
- 1% of projects which received BERI's help were made slower or more difficult by BERI's involvement.2

What do you like about BERI?


- BERI is easy to work with. [My contact at BERI] is fantastic at communicating and has been an enormous help.

- I don't know if I could have set up [organization] and some of the [project] work without BERI. It seemed pretty essential for that. For that work, I found working with BERI to be great. [My contact at BERI] was highly responsive and really helped us through some tricky operations issues.
- Fast, uncomplicated, friendly
- Quick and helpful responses to queries, very little admin time required from me, willing to support experimentation.
- It enables us to be a better, more effective team
- Clear easy to understand niche. Very helpful when called on.
- My interactions with BERI have been professional and swift; I really enjoy working with BERI, and [my
 contact at BERI] in particular. So far, BERI always actively tried to solve any problems I have
 approached them with, and all in all, they found a way to solve most of them.

What do you dislike about BERI?


- The advice is generally 90% good but sometimes not. [Example with identifying information]. So I think sometimes it would have been better to follow my intuition.

 operations to [a different organization]. It would have been really useful to be able to stay at BERI or
