Reading & Disposition of the Minutes:

A motion was made by Mr. Walker and seconded by Mr. Coss to approve the minutes of the Regular Council Meeting held on June 9, 2022. All members of Council present voted yes.

Purchases & Approvals:

A motion was made by Mr. Walker and seconded by Mr. Coss to excuse Councilman Glover because of illness. All members of Council that were present voted yes.

A motion was made by Mr. Walker and seconded by Mr. Cassella for the approval of the June and July 2022 Financial Reports. All members of Council that were present voted yes.

A motion was made by Mr. Walker and seconded by Ms. Schonauer to approve the VonArbor Tree Service quote for the removal of trees at Lee Lydic Park for a total of \$1,800.00. All members of Council that were present voted yes.

A motion was made by Ms. Schonauer and seconded by Mr. Walker to approve up to \$300.00 for trimming of the leaning Willow tree near the pavilion at Lee Lydic Park. All members of Council that were present voted yes.

Legislation:**Resolution No. 26-2022**

A resolution by the Council of the Village of Perry, Lake County, Ohio, to levy assessments for the improvement of various streets in the Village of Perry by supplying streets with electric street lighting and sidewalks and declaring an emergency.

Third Reading: 8/11/2022

A motion was made by Mr. Cassella and seconded by Mrs. Shimko to pass Resolution No. 26-2022. All members of Council that were present voted yes.

Ordinance No. 2022-07

An ordinance amending section 351.15 all night parking of the codified ordinances of the Village of Perry, Ohio, pertaining to the regulation of parking throughout the Village and declaring an emergency.

First Reading: 6/9/2022

Second Reading: 8/11/2022

Discussion:

Mr. Walker have receiving inquires and have discussion with residents about all night no parking or just leave no parking with snow band. He found just as many not wanting change as wanting change and they are glad we are discussing it. He suggests passing no overnight parking all year and then allow residents get permits for only parking on the street for a certain time.

Mr. Cassella the responsibility should be placed on the property owner to come in and request a permit in which it must include all vehicles. We also need to look at how it would impact our Police Department and we should limit how times a year the resident would be allow to request a permit.

Mayor Gessic indicated that the problem is with college children coming home on breaks.

Mr. Coss indicated we must look at what will have the least amount of responsible on our Police Officers and that he is in favor no parking between 12:00 (Midnight) and 8:00 AM and if a car is in the street just ticket it.

Chief Hager indicated that he like Mr. Cassella statement about putting the responsibility on the property owner to register or Council can vote (like they do with allowing fireworks) to allow parking on streets for Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Year's Eve (unless there is a snow event expected) or other holidays.

Ms. Schonauer reminded Council that the older homes in the Village was built when families only had one vehicle now almost every drive in the home has a vehicle. We need to consider the additional cost for staff if we do the permits.

Mrs. Shimko does not like the idea of allowing parking on the streets.

Resolution No. 31– 2022 (1st Reading)

A resolution authorizing and directing the Mayor to enter into an agreement with LCN Holding, Inc. to provide for the leasing of certain real property for the period of February 1, 2023 through January 31, 2024 and declaring an emergency.

Resolution No. 32– 2022

A resolution amending Resolution No. 28-2022 and approving the permanent appropriations funds for the Village of Perry, Ohio for the Year 2022 and declaring an emergency.

A motion was made by Mr. Walker and seconded by Ms. Schonauer to suspend the rules. All members of Council that were present voted yes.

A motion was made by Mr. Walker and seconded by Mrs. Shimko to pass Resolution No. 32-2022. All members of Council that were present voted yes.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

Mayor:

1. Informed Council that sidewalk repairs have started along Center, Manchester, Call, Maple and Thompson Streets along with adding new sidewalk in front of the Post Office and repairing the Road Department apron.
2. Informed Council that he had discussion with the County and they maybe looking to replace the bridge on Manchester in two years.
3. Informed Council that he had reach out to the County about Green Street water lines and that it is at least 8 – 10 years out before replacement.

Police Chief/Street Commissioner:

4. Chief Hager verified that it would be ok to install cold patch (about \$120) to the basketball court that the school owns since the school does assist us by doing repairs that require the use of the school bucket truck. Council is Ok with it.
