


#### **PTO Meeting Tomorrow! Please Join Us!**

### World Language!

#### For 2nd Grade Mandarin Class

In our 2nd grade Mandarin class, we learned how to introduce ourselves by sharing our name, age, and grade level, as well as talking about our family.

We also watched a few episodes of the Chinese story My Little Dianersole. As part of our cultural exploration, we learned about Beijing, the capital of China, which was historically known as Peking. The name "Beijing" means "Northern Capital." Beijing has served as the capital six times throughout history and is the second-largest city in China.

Additionally, we explored Shanghai, a city with a long history as a gateway to China on the Yangtze River Delta. It is the country's largest economic and trade center and one of its cultural hubs. Shanghai is often called "The Pearl of Asia" and "The Paris of the East" due to its vibrant international atmosphere. It is a city of youth, commerce, and dynamic energy that flows through its streets and river walks. As of 2020, Shanghai had a city proper population of 24.87 million, making it the world's largest city.

In our 3rd grade Mandarin class, we learned how to introduce our friends and talk about the activities we enjoy.

We continued watching the Chinese story My Little Dianersole and explored the Wild Animals channel, where we learned about different animals.

As part of our cultural exploration, we "visited" Hangzhou, a city famous for its tea and silk, and Suzhou, often called the "Venice of the East" because of its many canals and bridges. Suzhou is also known for its beautiful classical gardens, with the Humble Administrator's Garden being one of the most famous.

Beyond exploring these two cities, we also delved into Chinese poetry and learned 静 夜思 (Jìng Yè S  $\bar{1}$  — Quiet Night Thoughts), a well-known poem by Li Bai. Li Bai was a famous Chinese poet from the Tang Dynasty, a period of great cultural flourishing in China from the 7th to 10th centuries.

#### For 2nd & 3rd Grade Spanish Class

For the past couple of weeks, we have been learning about the community. Students explored different community helpers, their contributions, what they do, and where they work. They also learned about how some people serve the community through volunteer work, while others do it as a profession.

As part of our cultural learning, we discussed community helpers in Spanish-speaking countries, comparing their roles and contributions to those in our own community. Students learned about traditional professions that are essential in Hispanic cultures, such as street vendors (vendedores ambulantes), artisans (artesanos), and market workers (trabajadores de mercado), and how these roles shape daily life in different countries.

Students had the opportunity to either write or draw about what they would like to be when they grow up. For those who were unsure, they could instead talk about their favorite sport or activity. Students were encouraged to use vocabulary learned in class, with visual cues to support their learning.

In the coming weeks, we will be learning about farm and wild animals. Students will understand the differences between domestic and wild animals, including where they live and what they eat.

To incorporate cultural learning, we will explore farm life in Spanish-speaking countries, discussing traditional farming practices, animals commonly raised, and the importance of agriculture in Latin America and Spain. Students will learn about culturally significant animals, such as llamas in Peru, guinea pigs (cuyes) in Ecuador, and the role of donkeys in rural areas. For wild animals, we will explore the Amazon rainforest, the Galápagos Islands, and other regions rich in wildlife, helping students appreciate the biodiversity of the Spanish-speaking world.

#### <u>Update from Nurse Keigan</u> 3/13/25

Thankfully, we are seeing less illness here in the last couple of weeks! Please continue to be mindful of keeping your child home if they are not feeling well.

With the onset of winter, there has been an increase in illnesses, such as colds, influenza, strep throat, pneumonia, respiratory syncytial virus (RSV), COVID, as well as norovirus (nausea, vomiting, diarrhea) throughout the state. In order to keep our school environment healthy and minimize the spread of viruses, please keep your child(ren) home from school if they are not feeling well and contact their health care provider if needed.

If your child tests positive for and/or has been diagnosed with COVID, influenza, strep throat, RSV, or pneumonia, please be sure to let us know in the school health office. In addition, please let us know if your child is home sick with a fever, nausea, vomiting, or diarrhea.

Your child may return to school when they feel well enough to be in school for full day days AND

- After being fever-free for 24 hours without any fever/pain-reducing medication;
- After they have resumed eating normally and have not had any recurrence of

Please take note that you must have a <u>valid Cori on</u> <u>file</u> to volunteer at Wheelock School. Wheelock offers many wonderful opportunities so don't miss out! If you are unsure if your Cori is valid please contact the office. All Cori's must be brought directly to the office so that we may take a copy of your license or passport (this must be done in person). We will then send it to Human Resources for processing.

Please allow one week of processing time.

Cori forms are valid for three years across all Medfield public schools.

- vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours if they have had a gastrointestinal virus (norovirus);
- After they have been on an antibiotic for 24 hours if they have tested positive for strep throat or another type of bacterial infection.
