



Holyoke High School students have the option of taking dual enrollment classes at the following partner colleges.

- All partners offer 1 free or discounted class per semester if you meet the criteria and the deadlines.
- We encourage students to choose classes at times that will NOT conflict with their high school classes. Afternoon and evening classes often work best (science classes with labs typically do NOT fit)
- You must involve your school counselor in the process! Let them know which class you enroll in so that they may adjust your HS schedule accordingly.
- Follow all dual enrollment guidelines listed in the Holyoke High School Program of Study
- Students who wish to take classes at a different college should consult with their school counselors before applying.
- Grade 11 and 12 students are eligible for these opportunities (grade 10 students may take college classes if they are enrolled in the Early College program)
- This informational sheet is intended for stand-alone dual enrollment classes. Students who are part of *HCC Early College* and *Westfield Promise* will work with their advisors to register for classes.

Follow all deadlines and protocols to be considered!

HCC Deadlines to enroll (apply, take placement test and enroll in a class by this date):

- June 1st: application deadline; June 30th: registration deadline (fall classes)
- December 1st: application deadline; December 15th: registration deadline (spring classes)

Guidelines:

- 2.5 GPA per HCC
- Dual Enrollment students will be eligible for a free class through the CDEP grant (this is only for students not involved in Early College)
- Grade 11-12

- 2.0 GPA per STCC
- Grade 11-12
