Each individual who applies for membership will be required to fill out this form and meet with the elder(s) for further discussion and review. This will include going over our church documents, confession, creeds, etc. After this, the elders will present the applicant prior to their confirmation to the congregation to allow for a time for any further questions to be asked of the applicant before they are confirmed as members. Once this time has been completed and any further questions have been answered, the applicant will be accepted into membership upon unanimous vote by the elders. If the applicant has never been baptized by immersion, the elder(s) will also discuss a plan for the applicant to partake in baptism.
