

Editing with Green Screen

1. Retrieve files from camcorder

- a. They should be wherever you put them after the recording tutorial.

2. Open Adobe Premiere Pro

- a. This is a purple icon, it should be on your desktop. -->
- b. You can also search for it on your start screen.

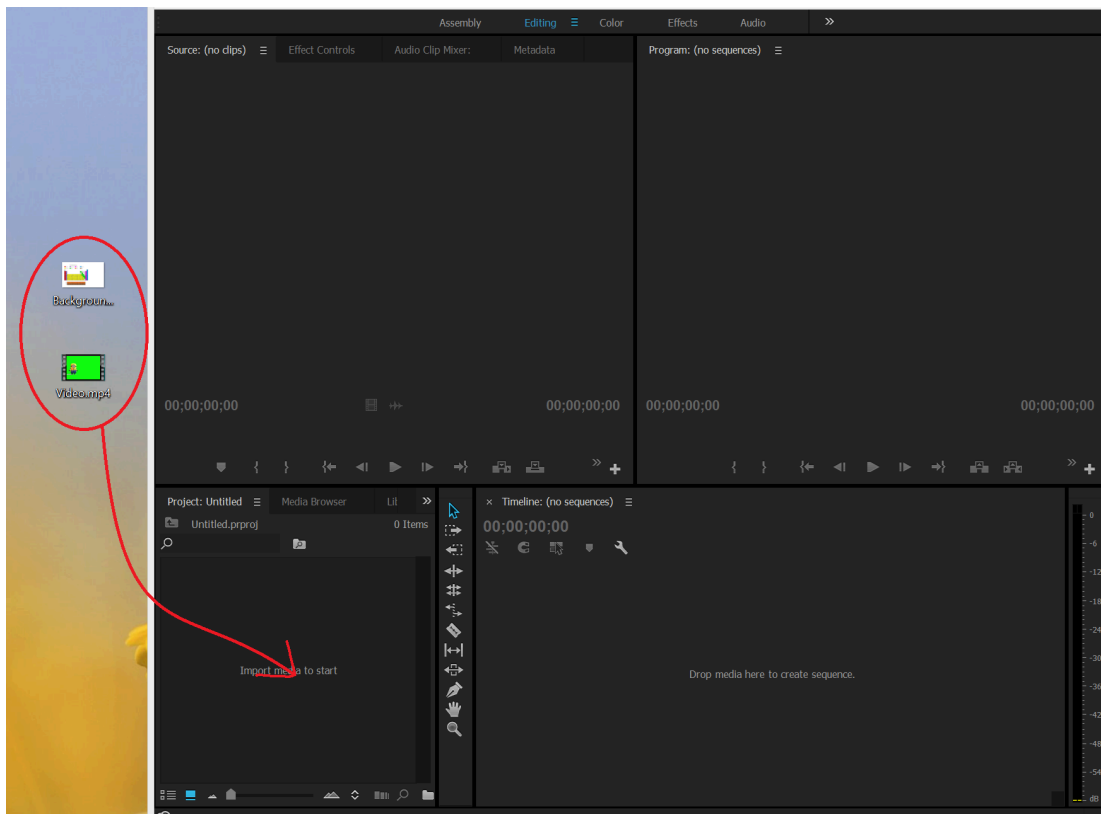


3. Click New Project in Premiere

- a. This is in the box that pops up when you open Premiere.
- b. You enter the name of your project here as well.

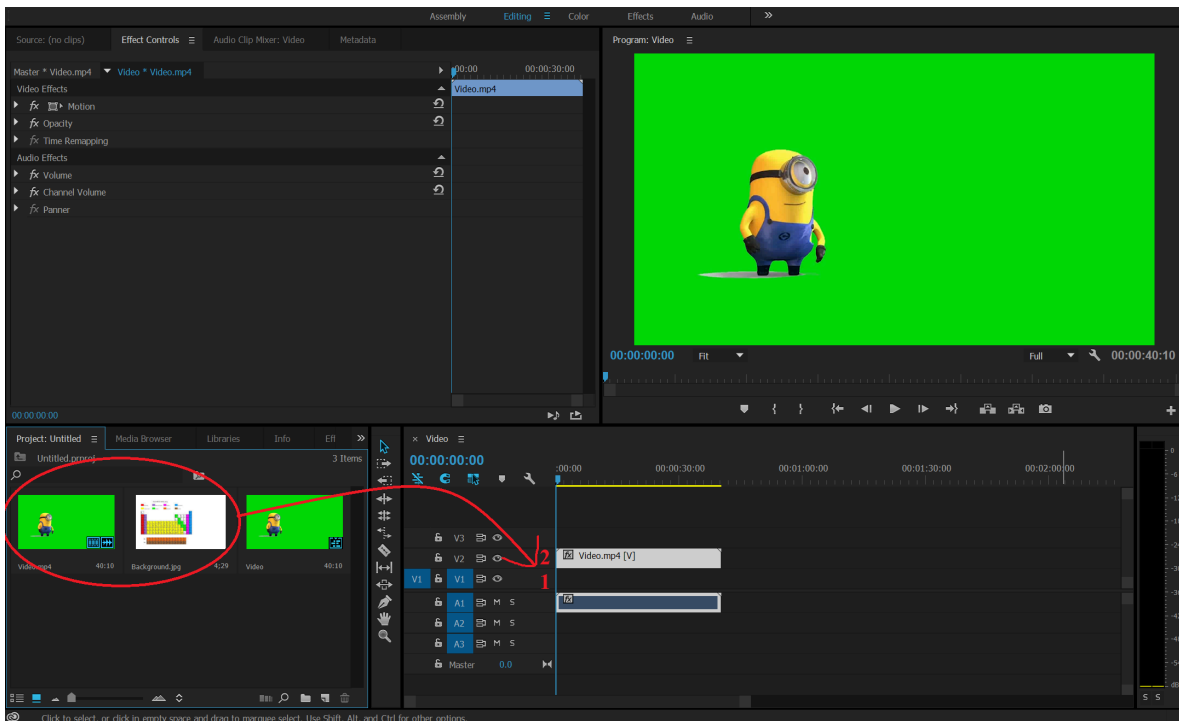
4. Insert Your Media

- a. You'll need to insert the video with the green screen, and the background image you want to replace the green screen.
- b. Drag the pictures into project tab, it should be in the bottom left corner by default.



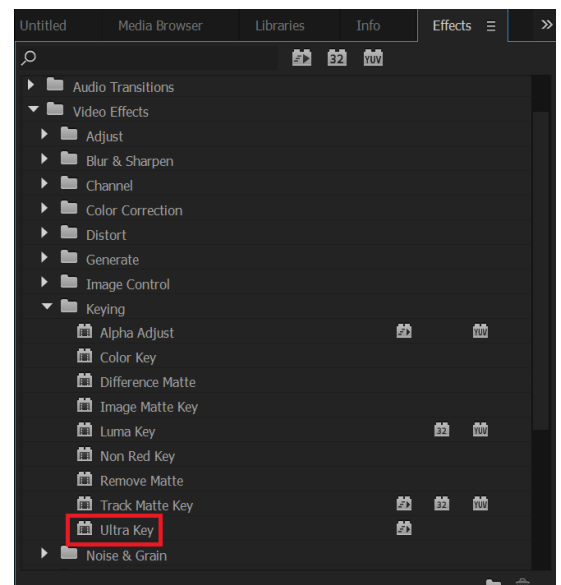
5. Move your media to the timeline

- Drag the video and image to the the timeline.
- Make sure that the video is on a higher level than the image, as shown in the screenshot below.
- Make sure that the image is displayed for the entire duration of the video, use the red bracket on the side of the image on the timeline to change it.

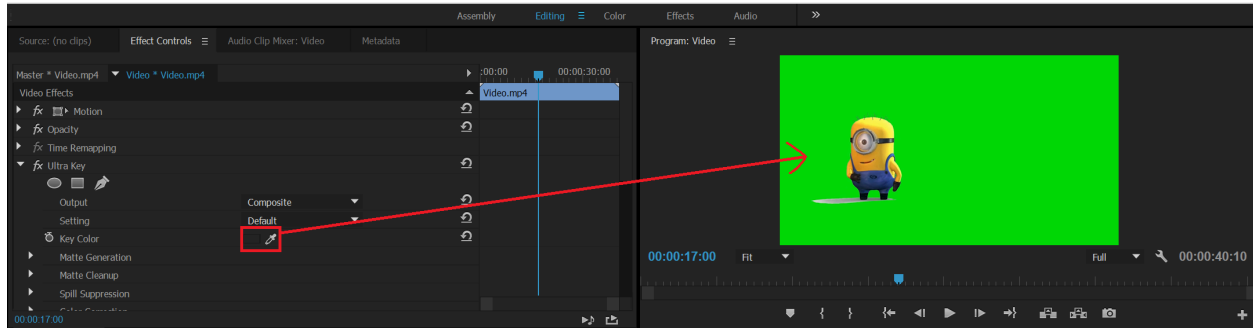


6. Add the Ultra Key effect

- First, change to the effects tab.
- Locate the ultra key effect
 - Video Effects
 - Keying
 - Ultra Key
- Shown here →



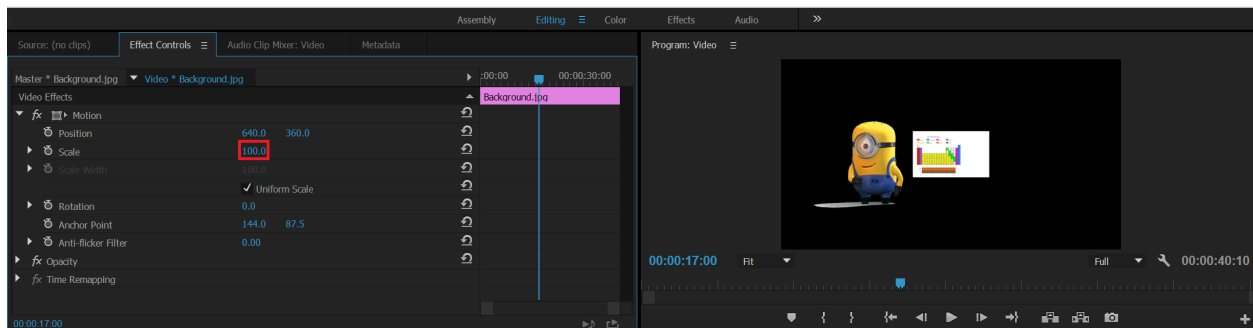
- c. Drag this to the video on the timeline.
- d. Click on the eyedropper and then click on the green background, as shown in the screenshot below.



- e. After this, you might have to change some settings to completely remove the green. Try lowering the Shadow setting, found under Matte Generation. Experiment with the others to get the best results.

7. Resize your background

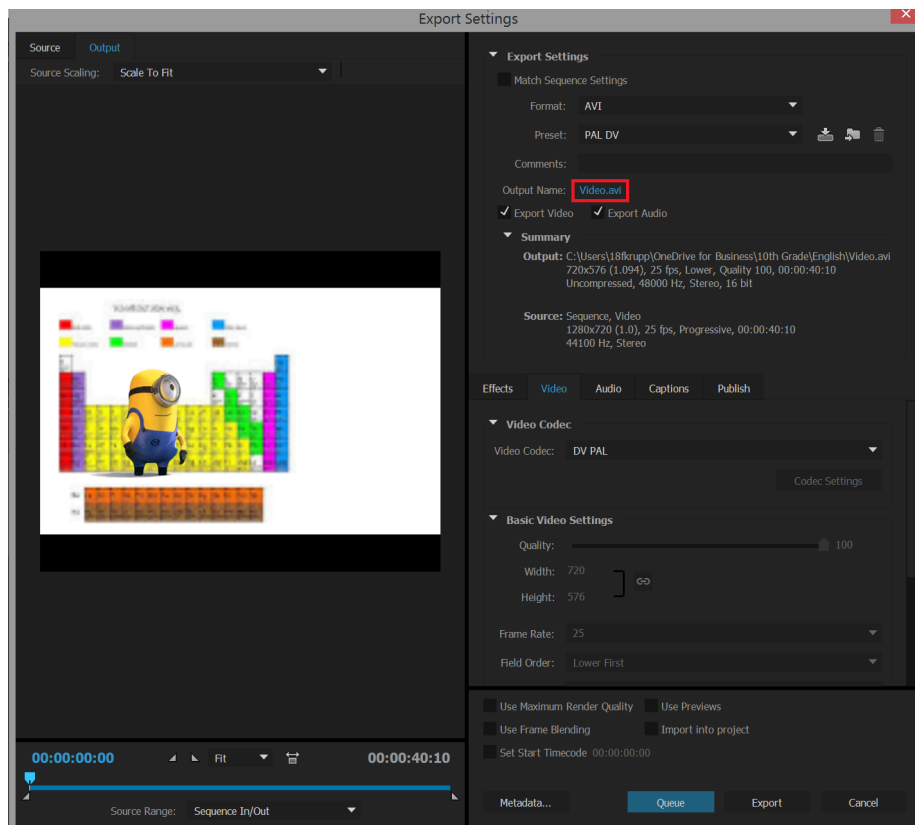
- a. You should now have your image in the background, but it will likely not be the correct size.
- b. To correct this, click on the image in the timeline, and then navigate to the scale setting, as shown in the screenshot below.



- c. Again, experiment with different values in order to get the best results. Try 200, 300, etc.

8. Export final project

- a. Go to the top left corner of Premiere, navigate to export media, shown in screenshot below.
 - i. File
 - ii. Export
 - iii. Export Media
- b. Click on the name next to output name to change the save location and name.



- c. Then click export, and your video should start encoding and then be saved.
