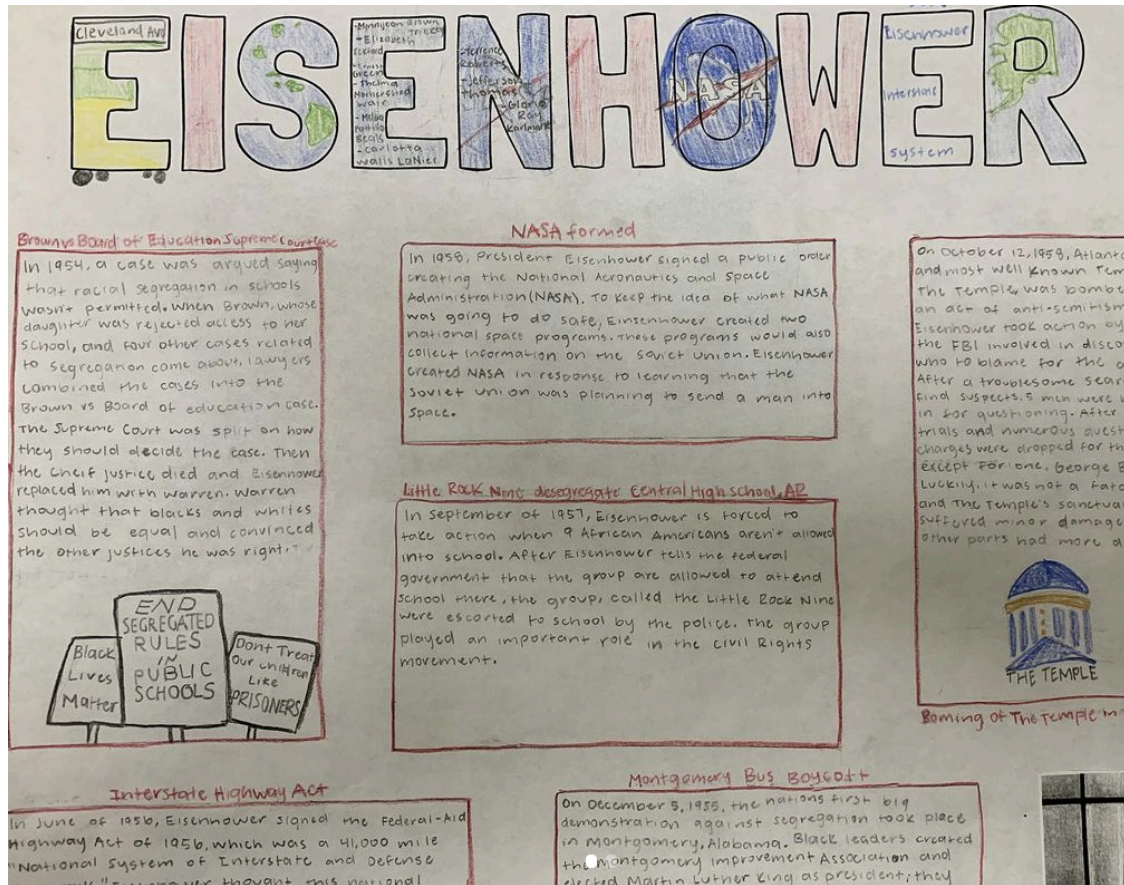

Facts: Providing enough information about the event/issue so that the reader understands it -- **5 points each term (60 pts)**

Images/Drawing/Creativity: The images are clear, easy to understand, and are creative in some manner -- **10 points total**
