Topic: Lunch at a Café

Objectives: - To learn and practice functional language for ordering food.

- To master "polite complaints" and requests.
- To distinguish between British and American English in food contexts.

1. Warm-up: Quick Discussion

- *What is your favorite local café and why?*
- *Do you prefer street food or a sit-down restaurant?*
- *Have you ever had a "bad" experience at a café? What happened?*

2. Vocabulary: Essential Phrases

The Customer	The Waiter/Server
Do you have a table for two?	Are you ready to order?
I'll have the [dish], please.	Still or sparkling water?
Could we have the bill (UK) / check (US)?	Anything else for you?
Is this dish spicy / gluten-free?	Enjoy your meal!
I'm afraid I didn't order this.	I'll be right back with that.

3. Grammar Note: Modal Verbs for Politeness

важливо уникати занадто прямих фраз на кшталт "I want...".

- **Could / Would:** "Could we get some more napkins?"

- **May:** "May I see the dessert menu?"
- **Would like:** "I would like the steak medium-rare."

4. Practice: The "Problem" Scenario

Робота в парах. Один учень — офіціант, інший — вибагливий клієнт.

1. The soup is cold.
2. There is a hair in the salad.
3. The waiter forgot the drinks.
4. The bill is incorrect (charged for two coffees instead of one).

Example: > *Customer:* "Excuse me, I'm afraid this soup is a bit cold. Could you heat it up for me?"

Waiter: "I'm so sorry about that. I'll take it back to the kitchen immediately."

5. Cultural Tip: Tipping & Etiquette
