## **Climate and Environmental Justice Student Staff - Spring 2025**

The Climate and Environmental Justice (CEJ) Student Staff will participate in the CSJ's inaugural CEJ student cohort. As a part of this cohort, student staff will convene for weekly training and development sessions to grasp various frameworks of climate and environmental justice, and deepen their understanding of colonialism, race, land, and other intersections with CEJ. Student staff members will also support the CEJ student coordinator, CEJ Justice Graduate Intern, and the CEJ Staff Member with managing projects for Spring 2025 in collaboration with other CSJ programs and internal or external community partners. To this end, they will support outreach and communication with students, student organizations, fellow CSJ student leaders and CSJ staff, GU departments/offices, and external community partners. Finally, CEJ Student Staff will engage with some external community partners, observing the skills of grassroots community mobilization, and learning the frameworks of reciprocal community engagement. This role calls for creativity, innovation, interweaving and transdisciplinary approaches, community engagement, and a passion for climate and environmental justice!

The following skills will be vital for any student staff member joining the CEJ student cohort:

- An intersectional approach to climate and environmental justice
- A passion to learn from peers, staff, faculty, and community members
- An open mind towards various perspectives and frameworks of sustainability and justice
- A general understanding of positionality, privilege, and power
- A focus on community-engaged partnerships and programming

CEJ Student Staff must adhere to the following expectations:

- Attend weekly 90 minute cohort meetings, with a maximum of 3 excused absences per semester
- Attend additional meetings with project partners from within their cohort, and internal or external partners as required
- Maintain good communication with the cohort, graduate intern, and staff member, to support each other as needed, and meaningfully assess and communicate one's own capacity for tasks
- Make a good faith effort to participate in any accountability processes that may arise with their CEJ student cohort peers, or any member of the CEJ or CSJ team, during their time as a CEJ student staff member
