 - Status of 1.15
 - Pretty much unchanged since last session.
 - Anything in particular that needs extra eyes before RC1?
 - o Proposals:
 - 39426 'go test' with no matching test files shouldn't fail
 - 39038 log the names of running tests on timeout (dupe?)
 - 38777 add a -debug build flag
 - 39559 new source meta tag (for module support, e.g. pkgsite)
 - 30639 remove APIs as a function of the go.mod version
 - o Other issues:
 - 39484 'go test -c' should error on unknown flags
 - 39761 update tools to follow GOMODCACHE
 - 1.16 aspirations
 - Big push for modules: lazy loading & replacement, retraction, go get for tools
 - Would like to go back to the "global install" issue: 30515
 - VCS for the main module version are we still undecided, or is it just a matter of drafting a proposal and implementing it? <u>29814</u> <u>37475</u>

 - Status of v1
 - Should <u>CL 221021</u> be picked up? Seems like an easy win if the merge conflicts can be addressed.
