Instructional procedure:

- 1. To start the lesson I will engage students by showing them a narrative and movie that was created by another student their age. They will also see a video on how we can create this and the steps to creating this masterpiece.
- 2. I will give students the topic: "How to save the Earth if you were a Super Hero"
- 3. Students will have to gather their thought and story they are going to create on a planning sheet. This will keep them organized throughout the lesson. Once there planning sheet is detailed enough and clear they will have it checked by a teacher in order to move on.
- 4. Students will then begin writing their narrative story using proper grammar and vocabulary. Once students have finished their story and had it check they can move on to creating their movie.
- 5. We will go over the steps on creating an iMovie and how to use animation, graphics, the cameras and so forth.
- 6. After this I will leave students to work on this for two sessions. The technology and librarian teacher will also work and assist students with their iMovie.
- 7. Final stories would be typed and published through the school.
- 8. Movies will be reviewed and edited before sharing and presenting.
