

Alternate Agriscience Fair Report

Part 1: Write at least 2500 (10 pages doubled spaced) words on your selected Agriscience Fair Topic that dives deeper into your subject matter (this does NOT include your Works Cited page!). This is shifting your Agriscience Fair focus from “experiment” to “analysis.” You will need to include a Works Cited page at the end of your paper and include in-text citations in your essay to let me know where you retrieved your information. **You may only use credible and reliable sources** (.gov, .edu, .org, etc.). Google Scholar and SCDiscus are excellent sources to help with finding the information. At least 7 **different** sources (from your Literature Review) are required. All citations must be in APA format.

You can set up your report with the different topic sections like your Literature Review. You can **not** use your Literature Review towards your report. This report will be done **individually!** If you were working with a partner, you each have to create a different analysis report.

You will need to turn in at least 2 new pages of your rough draft when the rest of the class turns in their project's Result, Discussion/Conclusion and Abstract/Acknowledgment portions. Their final report will be your final report grade. You may work on your paper while the class works on the last components of the Agriscience Fair Written Report. Anything not completed in class will need to be done outside of class, like the experiment portion of the project.
