Council Breakdowns

Beginner Security Council - International Water Rights

In 2020, tension between China, surrounding states, and the United States have exponentially increased through an increased military presence in the South China Sea. Beijing considers the majority of the South China Sea to be an inalienable territory of the Chinese Government. With the U.S.-China trade war and the spread of Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19), tensions have significantly increased between China, surrounding the states, and the U.S. which are expected to increase. In April of 2020, Vietnam sent a formal complaint about China's actions after a Chinese vessel rammed and sank a Vietnamese fishing boat near the Paracel Islands, which is within reach of Vietnam's east coast.

With increased Chinese aggression, this council must come together to de-escalate the tensions as well as prevent future acts of war that may affect civilians. We ask you that you, the delegates, must conduct a constructive and inclusive debate, as well as explore the complexities of how water disputes not only affect militaries but also civilians.

Beginner / Intermediate Human Rights Council (UNHRC) - Human Rights Concerns and Extreme Nationalism in Poland

During the past decades, Poland has experienced a large shift both culturally and politically. Poland, being formerly occupied by both Nazi Germany and the USSR, has one of the most complex relationships with governance and politics in the whole of Europe. Poland is predominantly catholic and traditionally right-leaning, meaning that the progressive ideals of the rest of Europe have not always been in line with

the cultural identity of Poland, particularly after the end of the occupation of Nazi Germany. This fundamental clash of the dominant culture in Poland and more progressive cultural ideals coming into Poland from the rest of Europe after the fall of the USSR came to a head in the early 2000s. Polish activists exposed the role Polish Nationals and Militiamen had in the role of violent anti-semitism perpetrated during the holocaust and Soviet occupation. Poland, a country that had long seen itself as the victim of the holocaust, was forced to reckon with its own role in anti-semetic violence, splitting the country in two, pitting Polish nationalists and conservatives against those who supported progressive ideals. Poland began reversing its progress with the Law and Justice Party, a right-wing populist political party, dominating government, with governmental checks on power quickly being eroded, causing Poland to free fall on international freedom indexes and sparking massive human rights clashes with several international organizations, namely the E.U and the UN. In 2020, widespread protests erupted after an anti-abortion bill was passed, causing the country to shut down. The UN general assembly expressed its concerns with this act, particularly relating to human rights.

In this council, you will deal with examining the relationship between nationalism and human rights abuses, the long-discussed issue of how far national sovereignty goes, as well as addressing the failings that lead what was once the model state for democracy in the eastern block to fall so quickly into extreme, anti-democratic sentiments.

Intermediate UNLDC - Lunar Independence and Development

The year is 2042. The United Nations has formed the United Nations Lunar Development Council (UNLDC) in order to address the specific interests of the growing lunar colonies and to allow lunar colonies to participate in the international stage independent of their parent nation. The UNLDC is also responsible for actions on international trade surrounding the moon in cooperation with UNOOSA (United Nations Office for Outer Space Affairs). Delegates from all the major permanent colonies currently operating on the moon *and* their parent countries will be present and focused on addressing Lunar Decolonization and Lunar Independence.

In this session of the council, the UNLDC will be discussing the issue of Lunar colonial independence, and the future of the lunar colonies. Certain elements of this council are outside of history or existing scientific ability.

Advanced - Historical Roman Senate

The potential and ability of the Roman Senate continued to increase as time progressed leading up to Julius Caesar's assassination, as Senators typically came from the powerful old families of Rome. This accumulation of wealth and status eventually allowed senators to become their own social class. Since the Roman Senate had the greatest effect on Roman life, it typically dealt with public funding, while also playing a large role with the issuing of the currency, and even administered the armies during a time of war. After the assassination of Julius Caesar, Rome

faced great political and social upheaval. As a Roman senator, you must decide whether to punish the conspirators, how to create good and lasting change, as well as face any crises that may threaten your course of action.

Of course, as political assassinations were common in this era, delegates will be allowed to assassinate each other in the course of this conference's events. Therefore, we ask that you follow the instructions listed on the registration form, and pick a backup senator, to ensure that you are able to still fully participate in the council as the Ides of March come to pass.
