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Project Overview

The US PREP National Center is announcing a Request for Proposals in the amount of up to \$100,000 each to enable US PREP providers to engage in an innovation pilot study. Each Year 3 or post-transformation coalition member is eligible to submit one proposal. The innovation pilot focus should be related to a problem of practice identified by the provider and district partners. Specifically, this RFP requires providers to work hand-in-hand with their district partner(s) to collaboratively identify a problem of practice and execute an intervention that will support their teacher preparation program and partner school district(s) in addressing their highest need. The chosen problem of practice should address K-12 student needs and data must be collected and presented to demonstrate the impact on preservice teachers and K-12 students.

NOTE: The recipients of the innovation pilot funding will be "under the microscope" of the US PREP coalition, as we will expect to learn from the pilot experience, outcomes, and deliverables generated. The school-university partnership recipient is expected to implement the pilot with exceptional fidelity and to work with the US PREP staff to progress monitor and measure implementation. Working with US PREP will ensure that the methodological design, data collection, and analysis serve the learnings - and subsequent, potential replication across the US PREP coalition.

US PREP will hold a webinar on **October 15 from 3-4 CST** to review the RFP, budget, and timelines.

A high-scoring problem-of-practice statement section will include:

- 1. A description of an authentic problem occurring within the school-university teacher preparation partnership context that has an impact on disrupting inequities in PK-12 schools via teacher candidate readiness.
- 2. Evidence that the problem of practice is of importance to both school and university partners.
- 3. Evidence of the school-university partnership's clarity about how the problem of practice impacts both teacher candidates and K-12 students.
- 4. Justification for how your problem of practice relates to a larger audience--specifically other coalition universities
- 5. Evidence that the problem of practice supports diversity, equity, and inclusivity goals set by either the university provider, PK-12 schools, and/or both.

2. What does the current literature say about your problem of practice? (6 possible points)

Create a literature review that summarizes the current research related to your problem of practice. This literature review should guide the development of your innovation and research questions (2-page limit, double-spaced). Note: The purpose of the lit review is NOT to summarize the "state of knowledge" related to the proposal, but to use the literature as a resource for planning the study. The priority is not about "contributing new knowledge" as much as improvement of local practice with respect to an identified problem.

3. Executive Summary (6 possible points)
Summarize your key goals, project outcomes, and highlight anything particularly innovative about your work. (1-page limit, single spaced, use bullets when appropriate).
A high-scoring Executive Summary will include:
 Specific and detailed teacher preparation goals that address the problem of practice at the teacher preparation and district level.
 a. Measures (that align to each goal) to demonstrate effectiveness of the innovation at the teacher preparation level
 b. Measures (that align to each goal) to demonstrate effectiveness of the innovation at the K-12 level
2. Evidence of the US PREP school-university partnership's capacity to actualize and implement the innovation with fidelity, within the timeline and budget
4. What are your research questions? (6 possible points) (1-page limit, single spaced)

A high-scoring Outcomes section will include:

- 1. A description of specific teacher preparation program changes or interventions to address the problem of practice
- 2. A description of the measures to be used formatively and summatively to demonstrate the impact of the innovation on teacher candidates.
- 3. A description of measures used formatively and summatively to demonstrate the impact of the innovation on K-12 students.
