## **Bird Boxes - Eco Council Report**

Ben and his crew from Street Forge Workshop came into school the other day to donate £250 worth of bird boxes, sparrow houses, butterfly houses, hedgehog houses and insect houses. The Eco Team helped find suitable places to put them up and most of the places were very quiet so that birds and other animals would come and use them. We really enjoyed helping the team and learnt that birds come in many different shapes and sizes and that the bird boxes are designed for specific birds. The hedgehog houses were specifically designed to ensure that predators cannot access the hedgehogs' habitat. It was all very fascinating.

Ben works for Street Forge Workshop who make lots of natural objects, such as bird boxes etc... using wood and natural materials, which are environmentally friendly.

## **PE kit days**

After discussions with parents and staff we have decided to alter our position on school uniforms with regards to PE Kits. If your child is attending a sports club either before school or after school, they may come to school in PE kit and remain in PE kit all day. **We are removing the need to change clothes in school.**

The one proviso of this is that children MUST wear the winter uniform PE Kit, which is:

Blue T-Shirt (no football shirts); dark blue school jumper or matching tracksuit top (no sports logos), dark blue or black jogging bottoms (no light colours or logos)

I want to remind you that school uniform is compulsory, **but school logos are not.** As long as you are colour matching... that's fine with me.
