Revere High School HOF Nomination Guidelines

The Revere High School Alumni Hall of Fame was created in 1992 by then principal, William Holko, to honor Revere High School graduates who have distinguished themselves. Nominations are submitted to the RHS Principal through the end of February for consideration of induction in the spring. Selection is done by a majority vote of the Revere High School Alumni Hall of Fame Committee. Criteria included: 1) the nominee as a role model for current Revere High School students, 2) the nominee has distinguished themselves and/or shown great leadership at the local, state, national, and/or international level through their chosen careers or vocations, 3). Alumni who have made distinguished contributions to Revere and/or society through their work or donation of time.

If you visit the <u>Current List of Hall of Fame Inductees</u>, you will see that the current honorees represent excellence in many areas of endeavor. The following is not an all-inclusive list, but hopefully demonstrates the many areas of accomplishment for which an alumnus could be considered for induction into the Revere High School Alumni Hall of Fame:

GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR INDUCTION INTO THE REVERE HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI HALL OF FAME

GENERAL PROCEDURES:

- 1. Maximum number of three (3) inductees per academic year.
- 2. Nominated to the Hall of Fame Committee by Revere citizens, faculty, students, and graduates. MAY NOT BE NOMINATED BY A PARENT.
- 3. Candidates shall be screened and recommended to the Revere Staff by the Hall of Fame Committee.
- 4. Inductees into the Revere Hall of Fame must be a graduate of Richfield, Bath, or Revere High Schools—with the exception of the "Special Honorary Category."

GENERAL CRITERIA:

- 1. Alumni who have been a role model for current Revere High School students.
- 2. Alumni who have distinguished themselves and/or shown great leadership at the local, state, national, and/or international level through their chosen careers or vocations.
- 3. Alumni who have made distinguished contributions to society through their work or donation of time.
- 4. Specific Examples:
 - ACADEMIC/CAREER ACCOMPLISHMENTS
 - A respected leader in his/her profession (involved in career-related activities).
 - National Merit Scholar and has demonstrated unique accomplishments within the area of their academic talents.
 - Recognized academic achievements in Revere High School and at the college or university levels.
 - ATHLETIC ACCOMPLISHMENTS
 - Recognized athletic accomplishments while a student in the Revere High School (state winner, All-Ohio, All-American).
 - Recognized athletic accomplishments at the college or university levels (national champion, all-Conference, All-American).
 - Special professional or amateur achievements (professional athlete, national competitor, Olympic participant).
 - CULTURAL/PERFORMING ARTS
 - A recognized name in the performing arts or contributor to the promotion of cultural activities.
 - MAJOR CONTRIBUTIONS TO REVERE SCHOOL DISTRICT
 - Promotion of the school's name and philosophy.
 - o A major influence in the lives of Revere students (by example or by contribution).
 - MILITARY SERVICE/PUBLIC SERVICE
 - Recognized as having had a distinguished military career or accomplishments in the line of duty.
 - Recognized accomplishments in serving in public service.

Note: the following criteria are for consideration in evaluating the nominees, they are not necessarily requirements.
