Клас: 11клас

Tema: God Save the Queen. Боже бережи Королеву.

Тип уроку: культорологічний батл.

Мета:

- познайомити учнів із життям Королеви Єлизавети II;

- розкрити усі культурологічні особливості та нюанси Королівської родини та самої Королеви;
- розглянути життєвий шлях Королеви Великобританії та її значення в історії країни, мову якої ми вивчаємо;
 - розвивати монологічне та діалогічне мовлення;
- розвивати навички аудіювання, сприймання на слух іноземне мовлення у розповіді та у пісні;
 - практикувати роботу у команді та в умовах змагання;
- виховувати повагу один до одного, вміти слухати та не перебивати однокласників під час завдань та ігор;
- виховувати в учнів відчуття поваги до англійської культури та її Величності Королеви Єлизавети II.

Завдання: здобувачі освіти повинні ознайомитися з життям королеви Єлизавети II, знати її життєвий шлях та значення в історії країни.

Комплекс використаних технологій методів форм і прийомів: технологія інтерактивного навчання, технологія проблемного навчання, технологія розвитку критичного мислення.

Обладнання: презентація, відео, аудіо.

Хід заходу:

1. Greetings.

-Good afternoon, pupils. I am glad to see you at our cultural battle "God Save the Queen". Queen Elizabeth II is Britain's longest reigning monarch. She has reigned for 70 years. Known for her sense of duty and her devotion to a life of service, she has been a figurehead for the UK and the Commonwealth during times of enormous change.

2. Warming up activity

- How did Elizabeth become the Queen? I propose to watch a short video and memorize some facts about her life, because it will be useful for your team. (Відео додано до презентації, за кліком мишки при демонстрації вмикається.)

3. Practice listening skills

- Every official ceremony, meetings or competitions begin with the anthem. The anthem of the UK is called "God Save the Queen", like our competition. Your task is listening to the song and writing the missing words. (Завдання на перевірку навичок аудіювання. В онлайн форматі це відбувалося так. З кожної команди обиралися двоє учнів. На кожного один слайд та 5 пропусків. Після двох прослуховувань гімну, учні на листочку писали слова та надсилали фото мені у вайбер. Перевірка на наступних слайдах з анімованими відповідями. При очному проведенні це командна робота. Потрібно просто роздрукувати слайди)

4. Practice team working

- Queen Elizabeth II is Britain's longest reigning monarch. She has reigned for 70 years. It is a very long period of time, from the young woman at the age of 27 to the honorable Queen at the age of 96. There are a lot of photos of Elizabeth II on the screen. Say, wheneverypicturewasdone. (На трьох слайдах запропоновано по 6 фото Королеви. За кліком мишки з'явиться дата кожного фото. Учні обирають серед запропонованих варіантів правильний, на їх думку. При очному проведенні команда обговорює та обирає. А у дистанційному форматі краще запитувати конкретну дитину, щоб не затягувати. Кількість фото за бажанням можна змінити.)

5. Making Personality type

-How can the personality of Queen Elizabeth II be described? Look at the screen. There is a heart with the main word Elizabeth II and a lot of adjectives how we describe the Queen. Name personal characteristics of Elizabeth II as much as possible. (Озвучте характеристику Королеви зі слайду з серцем, потім треба повернутися на попередній слайд. 6. Agree or disagree with a statement

- There are many interesting facts about Elizabeth II. Every member of the team should say if the statement is true or false. (15 запитань з анімованою відповіддю для кожного гравця)

7. Project works

- The role of Her Majesty the Queen Elizabeth II is unbelievable. She is the Head of State, the Head of Nation, the Head of the Commonwealth, the Head of the Church of England, and the Head of the Armed Forces, the Patron of Charities and Constitutional Responsibilities. Next task is for your captain. You've prepared a short project about the role of Her Majesty. Present it for us.

1. The best things about being the Queen of the UK

No one knows royal protocol like Her Majesty. As England's longest reigning sovereign, Queen Elizabeth II has dedicated her life to the crown, and all of the rules and restrictions that come with it. There are the best things about being the Queen of the UK.

- Drive a car without a license.
- Decide the royal dress code.
- Avoid getting arrested.
- Dismiss a prime minister.
- Open Parliament in the UK. While many see Queen Elizabeth as a symbolic figurehead in government, one of her many duties as the head of state is to lead the State Opening of Parliament each year.
- Go cashless. The only time the Queen leaves the castle with a few bills in her bag is on Sunday, so she can donate to the church.
- Put her face on the currency in multiple countries. Queen Elizabeth is pictured on the currency of 35 countries around the world.
- Have access to special jewelry. Some pieces are owned personally by the monarch, while those used for coronations and other important ceremonies are considered crown jewels.
- **Declare war.** Well, the special powers bestowed upon the crown also say that the Queen can declare war and peace.

Nevertheless, the Queen of the UK is out of politics. But after starting the war in our country she always supported Ukraine. It shows not only in humanitarian assistance, but she dressed using our national colors, blue and yellow. And everyone understood her message.

2. A life of duty: Queen Elizabeth II's charity work

In fact, the Charities Aid Foundation once described the Queen as "one of the world's greatest supporters of charities".

Here are just a few examples of the causes that Her Majesty championed during her record-breaking reign.

British Red Cross

The Queen became its patron in 1949 and went on to visit many people who were helped by the British Red Cross.

Leonard Cheshire

Leonard Cheshire is a charity that helps disabled people to live their most independent lives in the UK and beyond. From 1969 the Queen donated funds to the charity every year.

Great Ormond Street Hospital

Possibly the best-known children's hospital in the world, Great Ormond Street Hospital held a special place in the Queen's heart. Queen Elizabeth II attended fundraising events for the hospital.

Cancer Research UK

One of the Queen's most significant charitable connections was with Cancer Research UK. She played a personal role at various events supporting the organization.

Dogs Trust

The Queen's deep affection for dogs was known across the globe. From the age of 18, when she was given her first corgi, Susan, her beloved pets were featured in numerous photos, both casual and official, and became synonymous with the monarch.

So, it stands to reason that the Queen was also the patron of Dogs Trust, which provides long-term care for dogs and finds permanent homes for as many of them as possible.

Over the years, the Queen took a keen interest in the charity's activities, hosting receptions at Buckingham Palace, meeting some of the older people who benefitted from the charity's work and supporting appeals. As Friends of the Elderly has stated, "Her Majesty has helped us support thousands of people throughout the decades of her reign."

3. Communications tips from the Queen

Queen Elizabeth II developed some admirable communications skills that we can all learn from.

1. Keep it low. The audiences respond better to deeper tones, so when addressing others, find the lower range of your voice to project.

2. Master the game of small talk.

The queen always communicated with different leaders of the world. Elizabeth refined her people skills, always remaining curious and asking questions. It's what makes people remember you favorably, the queen's mother advised her. So, take the queen's mum's advice: "If you find somebody a bore, the fault lies with you."

3. Be diplomatic.

Queen Elizabeth II was not looking to make enemies, or waves. She rarely shared her views on political matters, didn't take sides in policy debates, and kept her opinions private. And she knew when it was OK to get personal.

4. Watch the clock.

The queen was a stickler for being on time and being prepared. She believed that being late showed a disregard for another person's time and implied that you think yourself to be more important (even though she probably was!).

5. Use your mistakes to get better.

The queen wasn't perfect. But she was adept at acknowledging mishaps and learning from them. Remember: Take the time to understand what you did wrong so the next time you can do it better.
