1. Pray weekly for one to three non-Christian friends, family members, coworkers, etc.
2. With one of these people, do one of these three things (based on Tim Keller's suggestions quoted in the *Spiritual Conversations: A First Step in Evangelism* guide):
 - a. Let others know of your Christian faith and activities in natural ways like your church attendance. E.g., "After church on Sunday my family..."
 - b. State briefly how your faith is playing a role in your life. E.g., "I've been praying that God would give me strength with stuff at work."
 - c. State that you're going to pray for a non-Christian regarding something they're dealing with. E.g., "I'm going to pray for you as you start your new position this week." or "I'll be praying for your mom's health."
