- 3. Manage basic interactions in the <u>present tense and with a limited number of</u> <u>past tense verbs.</u>
- 4. Arrive in future classes on time with the necessary materials, exhibit appropriate classroom behavior, and <u>complete homework assignments</u>
- 5. <u>Use language lab software</u>, the internet, voice mail, and keyboarding skills to develop English language skills continually.
