8. Campus Accessibility Presentation

- *Milan Novakovic, Graduate Student at University of Central Arkansas*
- Why accessibility matters - and how student leaders can help and keep it in mind
- 19% of undergrad students have a disability - whether mental or physical
- Reflection Questions on Recent Events or Programs Attended:
 - i. How was information shared (method, sign-language), accessible chairs/seating or access, diverse food options, were accommodations offered, size inclusive meeting spaces, visual descriptions & narrating the screen, asking for accommodations
 - 1. NCSU - Alyssa Pickens - chairs and seating taking up space in dining area of (a particular restaurant?), no automatic button but people there to open door, %
 - ii. What can create barriers for students to attend, ie event held upstairs without elevator or no closed captioning in virtual meetings, fraternities orientation were held in inaccessible places
- Universal Design - design of products/environments to be usable by all people, to greatest extent possible, without need for adaptation
 - i. Allow people to participate with little barriers or changes needed - not the student's responsibility to make the event accessible to them, discourages disabled students- up to us as event planners
 - ii. **Core Focus Areas**

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1. Be self aware of personal biases - accessibility does not look the same for everyone - accessibility for one group does not look the same across the board - don't make assumptions - Is the information itself accessible?
 2. Materials - Flyers and other marketing materials have captions, sign-language interpreters available, events can be attended with physical abilities
 3. Environments: location/chairs/table is accessible
- iii. Looking to the Future
1. Ask if accommodations are needed in registration forms.
 - a. If you need accommodation, please ...
 2. Select venues which don't have physical barriers
 3. Make flyers accessible by adding alt text
 4. Consider non-physical disabilities, such as learning and communication styles
