Rosetta Bakery - Seriously the cutest and most delicious bakery! A must-stop, grab a pastry and stroll the streets of Roma.

Buna/Sartoria - former is a coffee house and latter is an awesome Italian restaurant. They are both in the same venue though and do the most insanely delicious mexi breakfasts.
