Process to View and Submit Claims

The Preferred Group Plan has launched an updated website. Please visit <https://mytpgplan.com/> and click on PGP Blue. If this is your first time logging in, your user name is ***your first initial, last name and last four of your social security number***. Your password when logging in the first time is ***Password01***.

For example: JSmith1234 and Password01

The status of your claim will be available on once you log on. Also, you can save a stamp and get your money faster by faxing your claim form and supporting documents.

What is an EOB?

An Explanation of Benefits (EOB) lists all the parts of a submitted claim. Teachers have noticed that there have been some errors on their EOB. This may cost the teacher and the Trust money. Please double check your EOB to make sure it matches services that have been rendered because there are yearly maximums to both the vision and dental plans. If you notice an error please give PGP a call.

Wellness Procedure for 2018-2019

The CTA BTF is not an insurance company. It receives its funding from the school district and from its members. When claims are less than this funding, the surplus is placed in a saving bank for use later. When the claims are greater than the funding, this surplus is used to pay these claims. Since the last audit of the Trust showed a very low fund balance, the Trustees had to make the following decision which was communicated to everyone in the September newsletter as follows:

The Trustees have voted to use the same procedure in the school year beginning July 1, 2018 as they used for the 2017-2018 school year. In other words, hold on to your wellness claims. At the end of this school year, the Trustees will determine how much money is available to reimburse such claims and inform you in the June newsletter how to proceed.

Catastrophe Major Medical Changes

The Group CMM Plan provided by BTF currently covers active and retired NYSUT and non-NYSUT Members. Effective January 1, 2019, the BTF will no longer be able to allow future retirees to remain in the Group CMM Plan indefinitely. All retirees in the Group CMM Plan on December 31, 2018 will be grandfathered and allowed to remain in the Group CMM Plan. However, as of January 1, 2019 all future retirees will be offered 18 months of Group CMM COBRA coverage upon their retirement. At the conclusion of the 18-month period the NYSUT retiree will be offered the option to transfer to the Voluntary CMM Plan. If the retiree is not a NYSUT Member their Group CMM Plan coverage will end without the ability to continue.

NYSUT members whose COBRA continuation period has ended and they chose to transfer to the Voluntary CMM Plan will not have the Critical Illness Benefit. The Voluntary CMM Plan does not have the enhancement of the Critical Illness Benefit (one-time lump sum \$2,500 payment.) This benefit is only available to Group CMM Plan participants.

Long Term Care Statement

Those teachers and spouses who have opted for a cost of living adjustment for their long-term care coverage from UNUM should have received a document in their school mailboxes late last month indicating their coverage amounts beginning January 1, 2019. Tax Break

As tax season approaches, we want to remind you that the New York State Legislature has passed a tax law allowing a state tax credit for premiums paid for long term care policies. The credit is 20% of the premium subject to certain restrictions. Please speak to your tax advisor to learn how this tax break can save you money. For the majority of those members of the Benefit Trust Fund who have chosen to purchase the long-term care policy from UNUM, this means you will have the Benefit Trust pay the first \$100 in premium and receive a rebate from New York State of 20% of the remainder after you complete your New York state tax return.

Our Health Advocate service is designed to help our members and their family, including parents and parents-in-laws, in dealing with medical issues. It is especially helpful to assist you with eldercare issues. The Health Advocate can help with a wide range of senior issues such as explaining Medicare, locating eldercare services and assisting with medication concerns.

When you call (866) 695-8622 for assistance with an administrative or clinical healthcare system issue, you are assigned a Personal Health Advocate who takes responsibility for helping you. Personal Health Advocates are highly trained registered nurses, backed by a staff of administrative experts and medical directors. They know the “ins” and “outs” of the healthcare and insurance systems and help our members save time and money, contributing to more positive healthcare experience.
