## Dies at Age of 69

William P. Britz, 69, of 1550 Delaware St., died today at 10 a.m. at Winnebago State Hospital. He had been ill for the past year.

Born in Oshkosh on March 10, 1889, he had resided here his entire lifetime. Mr. Britz had been employed by Paine Lumber Company, Leach Company and Wisconsin Axle Division before his retirement eight years ago. He served with the Army in World War I, was a member of Cook-Fuller Post of American Legion and Equitable Reserve Association.
