



Master Homebrewer Program

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1. Objective

The Master Homebrewer Program is a nonprofit organization established to promote the mastery of amateur brewing. The objectives of the program are as follows.

1. To recognize brewers for their excellence in the production of high-quality beer, mead and cider.
2. To promote the hobby of homebrewing by incentivizing brewers to stretch their breadth of knowledge across all styles.
3. To act symbiotically with the BJCP, encouraging participation in competition.
4. Establish a quick and easy means of identifying experts in the field of brewing.

2. Eligibility

The Master Homebrewer program is eligible to any resident of the USA aged 21 and older.

3. How it works

The Master Homebrewer Program is aligned with the scoring system of the 2021 version of the Beer Judge Certification Program, including Appendix B - Local Styles. Members of the program will be eligible to receive rankings and awards based upon scoresheets from a beer judge from an AHA or BJCP sanctioned homebrewing competition. The scoresheets need to follow the standard BJCP scoring break down for beer, cider, and mead. For beer the standard categories are Aroma, Appearance, Flavor, Mouthfeel, and Overall Impression. Aroma can be awarded a max of 12 points, Appearance a max of 3 points, Flavor a max of 20 points, Mouthfeel a max of 5 points, and Overall Impression a max of 10 points for a total max of 50 points. For Mead and Cider the standard categories are Appearance, Bouquet/Aroma, Flavor, and Overall Impression. Appearance can be awarded a max of 6 points, Bouquet/Aroma a max of 10 points, Flavor a max of 24 points, and Overall Impression a max of 10 points for a total max of 50 points.

Once you have received your scoresheet, you will need to upload to the Master Homebrewer Program website a scanned PDF scoresheet, photographed scoresheet, or a screenshot from a competition website showing your assigned scoresheet score along with the judge ranking who assigned the score.

Our team will take these scores and enter them into the database and advise of any advancement achieved.

4. Official Rules

This program relies on the honor system. Any breach of the rules below will result in disciplinary action up to and including expulsion from the program

- Entries and star awards may be as an individual or team brewer. In the event that an entry has been submitted by a team or a star award has been earned by a team, the assigned score/star shall be given to all team members individually.
- No member shall ever lose recognition for any program level achieved due to a revision of program rules.
- Advancing requires achievement of all previous levels, i.e. no skipping/jumping of levels are permitted.
- All homebrewed products must be produced by yourself, using ingredients available to an average consumer. Examples of non-compliant entries include
 - Production of a beer using a production brewery produced wort (i.e. wort share)
 - Production of a product whose ingredients are only available to professional breweries, restaurateurs, or other food professionals
 - Production of a product using propagated yeast obtained from a production brewery, meadery, or cidery.
 - Repackaging a commercial product as a self- produced product. (immediate expulsion)
- All products must be judged by blind taste test.
- Retroactive scoresheets from previous competitions will be honored provided they meet all the requirements above

- Individual sour or lager beers entered in alternative categories may be included on a case by case basis. For example, if a sour lager is entered under category 34 and is scored as a 43+, this beer will qualify as both a lager and a sour under the program.

5. Code of Conduct

The Master Homebrewer Program is built on trust and relies on the honor system. Participants are expected to uphold the highest standards of honesty, sportsmanship, and ethical conduct.

Section 1: Prohibited Conduct

The following actions are strictly prohibited and may result in disqualification, revocation of rank, or permanent removal from the program:

Altering Scoresheets

Modifying official scoresheets in any way to inflate scores or misrepresent judge feedback is expressly forbidden.

Fabricating Scoresheets or Results

Creating fake scoresheets or submitting fabricated results from competitions that did not occur is a serious violation of program rules.

Submitting Work Not Your Own

Presenting beer, cider, or mead brewed by someone else as your own entry for credit is considered fraud and will not be tolerated.

Likewise, submitting scoresheets from entries that were not brewed by you—even if the competition was legitimate—constitutes misrepresentation and is a violation of program integrity.

Falsifying Competition Details

Misrepresenting competition dates, entry categories, or placement outcomes in order to manipulate records, scores, or advancement in the program is prohibited.

Tampering with Other Participants

Attempting to sabotage, misrepresent, or otherwise interfere with another participant's entries, documentation, or judging results is grounds for immediate expulsion.

Section 2: Verification and Documentation

All submitted materials, including scoresheets, competition confirmations, and entry records, are subject to random or targeted verification by the Program Board.

If discrepancies are found, participants may be asked to provide supporting documentation such as entry receipts, organizer confirmations, or correspondence with competition officials.

Failure to comply with verification requests, or providing falsified documentation, may result in disciplinary action.

Section 3: Disciplinary Actions

The Master Homebrewer Program reserves the right to impose disciplinary actions based on the severity and frequency of the offense, including:

- Written warning
- Temporary suspension from the program
- Disqualification of specific entries or achievements
- Revocation of any previously awarded rank or certification
- Permanent removal from the program

Section 4: Appeals Process

Participants may appeal any disciplinary decision by submitting a written appeal to the Program Board within 30 days of notification. Appeals will be reviewed by a designated Integrity Committee not involved in the original decision. The committee's ruling is final.

Section 5: Statement of Integrity

The Master Homebrewer Program thrives on mutual respect and a shared passion for the craft of brewing. Integrity is not just a rule—it is a value that sustains the credibility and spirit of this community. We ask all participants to uphold these standards for the benefit of themselves, their fellow brewers, and the legacy of the program.

6. Rule Changes

An annual meeting for MHP and CoA rules changes will take place every year in the month of September, to review and propose possible changes, additions or removals of items pertaining to the Master Homebrewer Program or the Circuit of America. That meeting will:

1. Be open to all board and paid/up to date members of MHP. If you don't attend that meeting, you can't vote (all proxies must be appointed prior to meeting beginning), meaning votes are done in real time, for all.
2. Change proposals require sponsorship by a MHP board member. Change proposals will be collected beginning of August up until the end of August within a calendar year through email request to all paid and up to date members. Sponsor shall present the problem and a possible solution/outcome. This is to be structured as follows (template to be provided):
 - a. Problem statement
 - b. Supporting argument
 - c. Recommended change
 - d. Q&A/discussion/Counter position
 - e. Call for vote (if needed)
3. While argument is presented, all others are muted until the presentation of the argument is done
4. Honor the results of a vote, as presented. Unless there's a tie, the results stand. In the event of a tie, no change is made.
5. Require all that plan to present an argument must submit that via the thread on the MHP leadership page at least 72 hours before meeting takes place.

TYPES OF CHANGES

1) Clarifications - Creating or expanding a definition within the rules for better understanding, but not CHANGING a rule, ex. what styles are considered IPA towards "Hero of Hops" - requires majority of board approval by vote (Can be done any time, proposed as a poll on Facebook group page, results locked after 24 hours). These changes will be recorded and communicated by the Secretary, to the membership via email.

2) Additions/Subtractions to rules - Modifications to rules or ranks that will result in adding or removing a Rank, Special Award in the MHP (1 per year), or a competition add/drop from CoA requires majority board approval vote. (Can only be done in annual rules review meeting).

Note: Rules changes that reduce requirements for earning achievements or ranks may be voted on by the board of directors at the annual meeting. Rules changes that increase requirements for earning achievements or ranks shall be voted on by referendum of the membership via emailed form, once the proposal for amendment is approved by the board of directors, and require 51+% of respondents approval. These polls will remain open for 72 hours.

Note: In the event that an achievement's requirements change, no member that previously achieved that award will be stripped of title/rank

3) Emergency rule changes - Extenuating circumstances that require a ruling for clarification, modification, potential disciplinary action or similar to maintain the integrity of the program. Rulings can be made at any time as they impact current year results - Require majority board

approval by vote (Can be done any time, proposed as a poll on Facebook group page, results locked after 24 hours). These changes will be recorded and communicated by the Secretary, to the membership via email.

Implementations

All approved changes to be implemented on January 1 of the following year. Notification of all changes will take place via email to all paid members of MHP. The secretary shall implement all changes to the rulebook and dashboard as necessary. IT director shall make all website updates or coordinate code modification by January 1 of the following year.

8. Stylistic and Outstanding Achievement Awards
