Beacon Education Institute (BEI) Accreditation process requires applicants to complete a self-study that aligns with our 22 operational standards. Below is a list of the

Core Educational Standards:

- Small Student Population: Describe how your school fosters close relationships and a supportive community. Provide examples of low student-to-teacher ratios or advisory programs.
- Student-Centered Learning: Explain how you meet students where they are, such as through individualized learning plans or multi-age classrooms.
- Curriculum Design: Detail how your curriculum supports diverse learning styles and real-world skill development
- Instructional Methods: Show how your teaching methods encourage creativity and critical thinking, such as through experiential learning or interdisciplinary projects.
- Measuring Outcomes: Explain your competency-based assessments and provide examples of student growth portfolios or performance-based evaluations.
- Whole-Child Development: Demonstrate how your school nurtures academic, emotional, and social growth, with examples like community service projects.
- Curriculum Transparency: Outline your curriculum philosophy and approaches, such as published course guides or parent information sessions.

Professional Standards:

- Educator-Led Leadership: Describe how your leadership model empowers teachers and learners, such as through teacher committees or shared governance.

Operational Standards:

- Policies & Procedures Manuals - Does the school have established guidelines that clearly communicate to all relevant stakeholder groups through defined policies and procedures? Are there Parent/Student Handbooks as well as Faculty (if applicable) Handbooks that convey those guidelines?
- Health and Safety Protocols: Provide examples of your health and safety measures, such as emergency drills or wellness policies.
- Financial Sustainability: Provide examples of your health and safety measures, such as emergency drills or wellness policies.
- School Calendar - Has the school developed a school calendar that meets or exceeds the school's state's or Beacon's attendance requirements of 180 days with 5 of those days for Faculty Development.

Community and Family Engagement Standards:

- Community-Focused Practices: Share how you build community partnerships, such as with local businesses or service organizations.

- Family Engagement and Communication: Describe how you maintain strong partnerships with families, providing examples like regular conferences, newsletters, or parent advisory boards.
