Continuation of Character Counts at the Jr. High level and HS level too Bullying lesson from Mrs. Evans in exploratory classes October 20-24 Less than 1% cases of founded bullying

- The definition of bullying requires consistent, repeated acts of name calling or inappropriate behavior that a student has asked someone to stop.
- The school investigates all complaints or concerns whether they meet the definition of bullying or not.

- Back pack program going now.
- Survey will be sent out around semester time
- 2 students said they wanted Friday, Students enjoy that they get a break, sleep in, activities, spend time with friends, families.
- 100 % positive amongst parents children, took advantage of three day weekends
- HS student stated they can still get meetings, practices in, stay with friends
- Other school districts are asking staff about how it works
- Allows for students to have more work flexibility
- Anecdotally, HS students have held other students accountable for attendance
- Students can get that extra day of work.
- Grades are better, less stress, Kirkwood fits into the four day schedule
- Longer day, many people have said they don't really notice it
- More discipline referrals at this time, but a student commented that consistent expectations and follow up have been good at secondary which is why that may be the case.
