## Implementation of Professional Development and Curriculum Materials

#### **Building PD Focus for 2018-19 School year:**

- Grade Level PD will focus on interventions focusing on phonemic awareness as well as writing.
- Grade levels will also work on implementing science and social studies within their schedules and curriculum.
- Building level professional development will be focused on meeting students social and emotional needs. Helping teachers to identify when students are in crises and how to handle those situations more effectively.

#### **Implementation Expectations:**

- Northeast building and classrooms will be a welcoming and safe place for students, teachers will use strategies learned through PD to recognize when students are in crisis and how they can then address the needs of students to help students regulate their emotions and feelings.
- Teachers will be meeting with their intervention partners on a regular basis, and looking at data to determine needs of students.
- Using assessments created by the SAC team to assess outcomes.

### How are we doing? What's our next step?:

- The faculty and staff are working to ensure all adults are following the PBIS expectations for our building. This is to ensure that all staff are modeling the expectations. Our staff has taken on this challenge and soaring with them. The lead team will be meeting to determine next steps and plan the initial implementation of expectations for next year. Our last All Staff PD will be held on June 3rd in the morning.
